poolside or inside, in this unique setting filled with Mexican artworks amidst authentic and colorful Mexican architecture. If you like to explore your artistic faculties or if painting or writing is already your hobby, this peaceful place will provide you a beautiful sightseeing for your inspiration. A brief stop will be made at the Golden Zone. The return to your ship will take you along Mazatlan's spectacular oceanfront drive.

Note: Participants must be at least 12 years of age, weigh no more than 250 lbs.

Old Mazatlan Walking Tour

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 2

Your journey starts with a short taxi ride to the Continuity of Life Monument, where your walking tour begins. You make your way to a rocky promontory to watch the local cliff divers. You'll learn about several monuments as you continue through Old Mazatlan, past the Military Hospital and Bank of Mexico building which is surrounded by old houses. Continue into the heart of the old downtown, where you'll find the historical center of Mazatlan, while your guide informs you about the area's history. Visit an old-style bakery, the House of Music, a museum, old houses and the magnificent and recently restored to its original European-style Angela Peralta Theatre, named in honor of the world-famous Mexican opera singer. Complimentary refreshments will be served before proceeding with your walking tour through the narrow streets, arriving at the city's Main Square. Here you'll find City Hall, the Post Office building, the Cathedral (dating back from 1875) and the City Market where your walking tour ends. You have the option to return directly to your ship or be dropped at the Golden Zone for some shopping. If you decide to go to the Golden Zone, it will be your responsibility to get back to your ship on time.

Note: Wear comfortable walking shoes. Sidewalks can be uneven in many areas.

Stone Island Beach Getaway

Approximate Duration: 5 hours

Level 1, Meal

From the embarcadero, begin your 30-minute journey on a motor catamaran across the harbor channel to Stone Island. Enjoy an open bar while you sail and watch the shrimp and tuna fleets, the famous Pacifico brewery, a view of the cruise ship and the Baja ferry boats. A typical cartload tractor will take you across part of this primitive town where most of the fishermen sleep on hammocks under the stars. You'll have four hours to spend in this setting, perfect for relaxation and swimming on miles of uncrowded, palm-lined beaches. Enjoy a horse-drawn carriage ride or horseback ride along these 12 miles of beaches and countless coconut trees. An island-style lunch of fish, chicken, salad, rice, beans, homemade tortillas and salsa is served in a rustic restaurant. Beer, soft drinks and domestic drinks are included.

Note: We recommend that you bring a towel, sunscreen, a hat and wear your swimsuit under your clothing. Local vendors are frequent at beach area.

The Best of Mazatlan

Approximate Duration: 7 hours

Level 1, Meal

Your tour begins with an interesting ride along Mazatlan's oceanfront for a view of the lighthouse and offshore islands. Continue into the heart of the old downtown for a short visit to the imposing cathedral before a short stop at a waterfront rocky promontory to view the brave cliff divers. Pass by the El Cid Resort before stopping at the Aztec Theater located in the Golden Zone to enjoy the famous Papantla Flyers show. Enjoy a complimentary drink while you watch these daredevil Totonac Indians ascend a 75-foot pole and descend on ropes spinning around the pole back to the ground. After the show, you'll have time to browse or shop at the Golden Zone before heading for a resort for an afternoon of swimming, sunning and relaxing, where you'll also enjoy a delightful lunch. Your escort will provide you with towels, a place to change and show you where lunch will be served. Your return to the ship will be by taxi in groups of four.

Note: We recommend that you bring your swimsuit, beach gear and leave your valuables on board the ship.

Are you ready to try Mexican salsa, margaritas and be merry? Then this tour is for you! Upon arrival to one of Mazatlan's beachfront resorts, you'll learn the art of making the best Mazaritas (Mazatlan Margaritas) in town and

experience a hands-on cooking class. You'll learn about spices and make a variety of sassy salsas while snacking on fresh cheese quesadillas and chicken taquitos. After your cooking lesson, get ready for some real fun! A salsa instructor will show you step by step, the moves and swings of the salsa. By the end of the tour you'll be ready for the dance floor and armed with fantastic recipes. After the class you'll have the choice to relax on the beach, enjoy one of the hotel's pools, or shop at the stores of the Golden Zone, located at just a short stroll from the resort. Towels will be provided by the resort for your use at the pool or the beach.

Kaktus Island Kayak Adventure

Level 3, Age & Weight Requirements

Your tour begins as you board your motor boat which will transport you across the navigation channel. Upon arrival, you'll be met by your guides who will help you warm up for your adventure with a short walk to the beach where your kayak awaits. At the beach you'll be outfitted with lifejackets and paddles and given a briefing over the safe operation of the kayaks, which are of the 'sit-on-top' variety. Then it's off on your guided ocean kayak adventure for approximately one hour, during which you'll circle the secluded Kaktus Island located just offshore. The completion of the kayak portion of your tour brings you to a beachfront restaurant where fresh fruit, Mexican pastries, bottled water and soft drinks will be waiting for you. After taking time to relax a bit, you may participate in the optional hiking portion of the tour which is approximately 45 minutes (1 mile) and takes you to a location offering a beautiful view. If you decide not to take part in the hiking portion of the tour, you may remain at the restaurant to swim, sunbathe or just simply relax.

Note: Participants must be at least 7 years of age and weigh no more than 250 lbs. Bring a towel, sunscreen, a hat and wear your swimsuit under your clothes if you plan to swim. There is no lifeguard on duty, swim at your own risk.

Sierra Madre Country Tour

Approximate Duration: 7 hours

Level 2, Meal

Rising behind Mazatlan is the Sierra Madre range of mountains, which separates the coastal area of Mexico from the interior. Rich in mineral wealth and extremely rugged, these mountains have become the subject of spectacular legends. Your exploration will carry you from historic Mazatlan to the Durango Highway, stopping at a brickyard where adobe bricks are handmade and fired much as they have been for several centuries. A short drive along the foothills of the Sierra Madre will take you into Concordia where you'll visit the 220-year old church and enjoy a refreshing drink at a typical small restaurant. Continue to the village of Copala, once a thriving Spanish gold mining town founded in 1565, where you'll take a leisurely walk through the cobblestone streets. See colonial houses, the jail and a spectacular church dating back to the early XVIII century and enjoy a delightful lunch of Mexican food at a local restaurant. Visit a furniture factory and a potter's home who produces roof tiles, jars, flowerpots and dishes typical of this region. Back at Mazatlan's Golden Zone you'll have approximately 40 minutes of free time to browse and shop before the scenic drive back to your ship.

Colonial Villages & Papantla Flyers

Approximate Duration: 5 ½ hours

Level 1

See Mexico's colorful heritage during this unique tour of surrounding villages with their cottage industries. You'll start with a stop at a brickyard where adobe bricks are made and fired much as they have been for centuries. A brief stop at the village of Malpica will show you a floor tile factory and a typical wood-fired bakery, sampling freshly-baked cookies. Next, you'll visit a home where colonial furniture and clay pottery are handmade. Continue to Concordia, founded in 1565 by the Spaniards, where you'll be able to enter and admire the famous 217-year old St. Sebastian Church. Upon your return to Mazatlan, enjoy the spectacular Papantla Flyers Show and some city highlights before you return to your ship.

Hike to the Lighthouse

Approximate Duration: 2 ¾ hours

Level 3, Age Requirements

If you would like to get the best view of all Mazatlan, you'll find it at this magnificent lighthouse, 515-feet (157 m)

above sea level. This is the highest natural working lighthouse in the world and at night, light can be seen more than 30 miles out at sea. Your invigorating day starts when you board your transport for a five-minute ride to the foot of El Creston hill, where the lighthouse is located. Soon after, your challenging hike will take you up the winding path to the world's highest natural lighthouse. If you are a nature's lover, don't miss this opportunity to see iguanas, tropical birds, butterflies and some exotic varieties of cactus and flowers along the way. Arriving at the top, your reward is the stunning view, which includes the Pacific Ocean, your ship by the harbor below and miles of Mexican coastline to the south and north. You'll have 25 minutes to relax, have a drink and take photos. Pass by the Historical Center before on the way back to your ship.

Note: Participants must be at least 12 years of age. Hike is on uneven terrain for approximately 1-1/2 miles, approximately one hour in duration.

Shrimp Fest

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 1, Meal

Come and enjoy one of Mazatlan's greatest treasures, its shrimp! A short drive from the pier will take you to the exclusive residence of Villa de la Cruz, where your Shrimp Fest will begin. The backdrop of the Sierra Madre Mountain range, the ocean, city and ships harbor will set the mood for your afternoon. Gracing the mountain side of Cerro de la Cruz, this lush private residence will be the setting for an afternoon of world famous shrimp and Mexican hospitality. Enjoy a buffet of freshly caught shrimp prepared in three different styles: peel-your-own, beer-batter fried shrimp and garlic shrimp along with traditional taquitos, while refreshing yourself and listening to the live music. Chips, salsa and guacamole will also be served along with an open bar of margarita's and Mazatlan's very own Pacifico Beer. After your meal, you can relax by the pool or walk through the beautiful historical downtown with its trendy Plaza Machado and city market at its center. You can either return to your ship or be dropped off at the historical downtown district of Mazatlan and return to your ship on your own.

Huana Coa Canopy Adventure

Approximate Duration: 5 ½ hours

Level 3, Age & Weight Requirements

Adrenaline will be pulsing through your veins after experiencing this canopy adventure! Situated approximately one hour outside of Mazatlan, the sprawling La Vinata Los Osuna plantation, where blue agave is grown and processed into tequila, is home to this exhilarating tour. Once you step off of your motorcoach, you'll be transported into a world that will take your breath away. The fun begins with the rush of an off-road experience in a classic Swiss Army Pinzgauer 6 x 6 vehicle delivering you from the valley floor into the foothills of the Sierra Madre mountain range that surround the plantation. From here, the action really begins to take-off. You'll get a thorough briefing on the techniques and safety measures used during the canopy adventure by a certified staff member who will provide equipment of the highest quality. A series of 12 platforms with nine zip lines, a flex-walk bridge and nature trek await you. The course provides extraordinary views of the plantation's diverse flora and fauna while soaring above the valley floor. A rappel from the final platform located in an ancient Huanacastle tree will bring you safely back to earth among the vast rows of blue agave. Before returning to your ship, you'll have time to visit the Los Osuna, a tequila distillery. There you'll see how this popular liquor is produced and be able to taste it as well. The return to your ship will be along Mazatlan's magnificent oceanfront boulevard passing by the Golden Zone, where you may choose to stay on your own for some shopping before returning to your ship.

Note: Participants must be at least 9 years of age and weigh no more than 250 lbs. Due to the nature of this tour, pregnant women or guests with a heart condition, knee pain or injury, spinal and/or neck problems or limited mobility should not participate. Please wear long pants, closed-toe shoes and bring sunscreen. Signature on liability waiver is required. There are two nature treks during the course of the tour, participants must walk approximately 1/2-mile (735 yards) over some uneven terrain, climb steps up to platforms and rappel 40 feet (12 meters) down to the ground from the final platform.

Mexico's rural traditions and its cultural dances, music, horsemanship and cuisine are the stuff of popular icons, presented throughout the world as national symbols of Mexico's colorful and festive culture. Nowhere are these traditions so alive and authentically presented to visitors as in El Quelite, the region's most colorful town. With a

This small country town has maintained its heritage and earned its fame for beauty because of the abundant clay tile roofs, clean and colorful streets, delicious food, abundant greenery and generous hospitality from its inhabitants. You'll take a walking tour through the town center to visit the 18th century church and other important sites of the town. Sit back relax and enjoy the show as El Quelite dancers, music and cowboys or charros, put on a traditional folkloric show that will lift your heart and deepen your understanding of Mexico's beautiful past and present. After the show, you'll enjoy some of El Quelite's famous cuisine in a local restaurant with chicken or beef tacos and fresh, hand-made tortillas. You'll also have free time for shopping in the colorful stores to find a treasure to remember your time in beautiful el Quelite.

Tequila Tasting at Mazatlan's Old Quarter

Approximate Duration: 3 ½ hours

Level 2, Age Requirements

Pull up a chair and take part in one of Mexico's most valued traditions at a famous local restaurant and bar located in colorful downtown Mazatlan. Travel approximately 15 minutes to the vibrant town center of Mazatlan where your guide will lead you on a walking tour among the art galleries, museums, churches and quaint historic streets. Discover the typical architecture, shops, restaurants and life-style of a Mexican town and learn about its customs. You know what they say, when in Mexico, do as the Mexicans do! Get a taste of the most important ingredient to a fiesta....Tequila! You'll try a variety of Mexico's most beloved tequilas amid traditional Mexican decor at the charming restaurant and bar. Then enjoy free time for shopping downtown or you may wish to stay at the restaurant and order some lunch (at your expense). When time's up, you can hop back on your transportation and return to the pier.

Note: Participants must be at least 21 years of age to drink alcohol. This tour is not recommended for guests with walking difficulties.

Temazcal Pre-Hispanic Spa

Approximate Duration: 3 ½ hours

Level 3, Age Requirements, Ultimate Touring

Take a spiritual journey in a Mexican Temazcal, a traditional Pre-Hispanic sweatlodge and participate in an ancient ceremony performed by the Mayans, Aztecs and many other pre-Hispanic people. Your cultural guide will speak about the history, beliefs and legends of the local indigenous cultures on your way to EduVentura in the Hotel Playa Mazatlan, located in the Golden Zone district of Mazatlan. Experience the benefits of this ritual cleansing as water and herbs are poured over the hot lava rocks and steam saturates your skin. It is an elemental experience of nature where the spirit soars through song, meditation and prayer, the body and skin are purified and the mind rejuvenated. After the Temazcal, cool yourself in the refreshing waters of a cenote (swimming grotto) and enjoy the beach, pool or shopping areas. Tour includes transportation, bathrobes, sandals and beverages. You'll have the option of returning to your ship at the end of the tour or may choose to remain in the Golden Zone and return to your ship at your own expense.

Note: Participants must be at least 12 years of age and no more than 55 years old. Women who are pregnant are not allowed to participate nor are guests with heart or respiratory conditions (asthma), back / neck injuries diabetes, epilepsy or those under medications such as anti-depressants, lithium, beta blockers and base vein constrictors.

ATV Beach Adventure

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 2

Explore the secluded beaches of Mazatlan on a scenic and exciting ATV Adventure and then enjoy free time to relax on the beach. You'll travel approximately 30 minutes by bus or van to Bruja's Beach where your 4x4 ATV will be awaiting. Upon arrival, your guide will provide instructions and safety gear. Hop on your two-person ATV and travel caravan-style along the most beautiful, off-the-beaten-path beaches in Mazatlan. Stop along the way to take photos and enjoy the natural wonders that surround you. You'll ride for approximately 1-1/2 hours then return to a beachfront restaurant where you'll have approximately one hour to relax on the beach. You may wish to order lunch at your own expense before returning by van to the pier. This tour is perfect for both the beginner as well as the more advanced off-road rider.

Note: Participants must be at least 18 years of age with a valid driver's license and weigh less than 290 lbs. Due to rough terrain this tour is not for pregnant women, guests with heart or respiratory conditions, back or neck injuries. Participants should wear long shorts or pants and close toed shoes, bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen. Wear your swimsuit under your clothes and bring a towel if you wish to swim. This tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility. Activities may be reversed to accommodate participants. Included is your choice of two beverages of either bottled water or soda.

Tropical Beach Horseback Riding

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 3, Age Requirements

The horse and the skill of horsemen are forever linked with Mexico and its history. Explore this most important aspect of the region's culture on a horseback tour through a tropical plantation and along the coastline and then enjoy free time to relax on the beach. Start with an approximately 30-minute drive by bus or van through the city of Mazatlan to Bruja's Beach. On arrival, your guide will provide riding and safety instructions. You'll find that all the horses are healthy, well-trained, highly experienced and ready to take you on a delightful adventure. Hop on and ride your horse through a tropical coconut plantation. Keep your eyes peeled for birds, iguanas and other wildlife. Make your way along the secluded beach for stunning views of this virgin landscape. You'll ride for approximately one hour then return to a beachfront restaurant where you'll have approximately one hour to relax on the beach. You may wish to order lunch at your own expense before returning by van to the pier.

Note: Participants must be at least 12 years of age and weigh less than 240 lbs. This tour is not for pregnant women, guests with heart or respiratory conditions, back or neck injuries. Participants should wear long shorts or pants and close toed shoes (no flip-flops or sandals), bring a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen. Wear your swimsuit under your clothes and bring a towel if you wish to swim. This tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility. Activities may be reversed to accommodate participants. Included is your choice of two beverages of either bottled water or soda.

Acapulco, Mexico

Participants must be at least 18 years of age to consume alcoholic beverages on any of the tours. For all Acapulco tours, we recommend that you wear comfortable walking shoes and light-colored, loose-fitting cotton clothes. Bring sunscreen, a hat and insect repellent. For all tours that involve walking, surfaces are usually uneven; cobblestone streets and steps are very common.

Level 1

Travel along the coastline while you learn about the history and culture of Acapulco. Stop at El Mirador, above La Quebrada, to enjoy a light snack and drink while admiring the world-famous cliff divers and a typical Mexican folkloric show. From a vantage point near Las Brisas Hotel, marvel at the incredible beauty of the panoramic

landscape. Continue to the outskirts of town and pass by one of two impressive hotels in the Acapulco Diamante hotel zone, the Acapulco Princess Hotel, constructed to resemble an Aztec Pyramid, or the Mayan Palace Hotel, built to resemble a Mayan Temple, as well as the black lagoon where the original Tarzan (Johnny Weissmuller) was filmed.

Note: There are approximately 70 steps at La Quebrada (to see the cliff divers). Physically challenged guests can enjoy the show from a special terrace.

Historical, Traditional & Picturesque

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 2

Drive through the old part of town and visit the Hotel Los Flamigos, once called the refuge of the Hollywood gang of the 1950s. Next, visit the Acapulco Historical Museum located inside the Fort of San Diego. The present structure was rebuilt on the ruins of the former fort, which was destroyed in an earthquake. Visit one of Acapulco's landmarks, the Chapel of Peace at Las Brisas residential area. This Chapel is beyond doubt a place of serenity and peace, located on one of the most exclusive residential areas in Mexico. Level 2

Share the emotion of the world-famous cliff divers at La Quebrada while enjoying a complimentary drink and magnificent panoramic views. Catch up on some shopping for hand crafts and jewelry. Then, stop at the famous Hotel Los Flamigos, where you can enjoy a drink while you travel back through history and visit the home of 'Tarzan' (Johnny Weissmuller) in its original setting. Visit the Fort of San Diego, the most important museum in the state of Guerrero and a present-day testimony to the history of Acapulco. Take a walk through the quaint streets of Acapulco's Zocalo, a traditional area that includes the Cathedral Our Lady of Solitude. The tour ends with a shopping stop at Plaza del Navegante, alongside the ocean.

Endangered Baby Sea Turtles & City Drive

Approximate Duration: 4 ¼ hours

Level 1

Take a scenic ride through downtown Acapulco and down the coast, heading south. About 20 miles away, on a tranquil beach, is the Sea Turtle Rescue Center. Operated by a local environmentalist, the center works to improve the chances of survival for the endangered species of Golfina sea turtles. Learn how the program works and see the baby turtles in various stages of development, from their eggs to the holding tanks where the hatchlings are ready to return to the sea. Walk down to the shoreline where the turtles will be named before they are released into the wild. The number of turtles that are ready for release may not always match the number of participants. A short shopping stop will be made on the way back to your ship.

Panoramic Views & Ancient Petroglyphs

Level 3, Age Requirements

Stone steps lead you up the mountainside to view the over 2,000-year-old petroglyphs left by the Yope Indians, the area's first inhabitants. Using skill and experience, the divers have to time the beginning of their dive so that the waters in the cove are deep enough when they hit. The highlight of the show is the master diver plunging over 130 feet into the ocean water below with only the light from the burning torch below to illuminate his way.

Level 2, Meal, Age & Weight Requirements

Take a scenic drive along Acapulco Bay heading west to the Coyuca Lagoon at Pie de la Cuesta. This lagoon consists of fresh water accumulated by the river system of Rio Balsas. After a brief introduction to your kayak, your professional instructor will lead the way, ensuring that you enjoy a smooth ride in the calm waters of Coyuca. Traditional palapas and the natural landscape of the Sierra Madre make this an unforgettable experience. Admire coconut plantations and discover the unspoiled jungle. Afterward, relax while you enjoy lunch before returning to your ship.

Head north towards Guatemala City. The entrance to the protected area that surrounds the volcano is located before arriving to the city, just before the town of Amatitlan. Once at the local town, your guided hike will begin. The hike is conducted by local expert guides and members of the local community who are certified as volcano guides and nature defenders. Your volcano climb will be approximately two hours long until you reach the upper platform. From there, the most fit and daring can continue to the peak, just above, where sulfur fumes, colored rocks and the crater make for a unique spectacle. The downhill hike is, of course, much faster, taking approximately one hour to return.

Note: Participants must be at least 5 years of age and weigh no more than 250 lbs. This hike consists of approximately two hours of climbing and one of descending on steep ground, so participants must be in excellent physical condition. The Pacaya is an active volcano that displays its might with constant small outbursts, but there is always the chance that a major geological event could happen with any volcano, so we reserve the right to cancel this tour at the last minute or to halt the climb at any time for safety reasons. The sites are small but provide a glimpse of the Mayan history and the relationship between other civilizations, such as the Olmec from what is now Mexico. It is known for a fact now that the Olmecs did in fact inhabit the south coast of Guatemala. Their great influence on the Mayan civilization is visible in La Democracia, Baul and also on Takalik Abaj to the west of the first two sites. Then you'll visit the nearby Maya Museum of Las Ilusiones where several artifacts found in the area are kept. Here you'll enjoy a refreshing drink before returning to your ship.

Picturesque Sarchi

At the heart of the central valley high in the mountains, is the small town of Sarchi, cradle to famous wood carvers and artisans that gave identity to the country's local craft and lore. You'll start your tour by observing quaint villages, fields of sugar cane, cattle ranches and coffee plantations, and traveling through the Central Volcanic Mountain Range where the deep green of its hills lies in dramatic contrast to the colors of the coastal region. A professional guide will get you acquainted with the country's history, politics and culture. You'll recognize the town of Sarchi by its bright colors and friendly people, proudly displaying the brightly colored hand painted ox cart – the country's typical symbol. Some shopping time will be given at the artisan's village. Your last stop will be the interesting town of Grecia, known for its unique metal church called the Cathedral de la Mercedes. This deep dark red-colored church has a Gothic style and is made from metal pieces that were imported from Belgium in the 1890s.

A Cloud Forest & Poas National Park

Approximate Duration: 8 ½ hours

Level 2, Meal, Age Requirements

From the low coastal areas, head into the clouds and discover the incredibly diverse landscape, the ever-changing vegetation and spectacular scenery that this journey provides. One of the most renowned parks in Costa Rica, the Poas National Park is one of the few cloud forests accessible from the Pacific coast. On a clear day, it is possible to peer into the volcano's crater which is surrounded by lush cloud forest, and see geysers of steam and smoke rising from the bubbling depths. After a visit to the park, continue your journey through spectacular scenery, which brings to mind the fields and pastures of the Swiss Alps. This is the region that gave Costa Rica its nickname, 'the Switzerland of Central America'. Soon you'll reach a traditional mountain retreat, where a typical 'Tico' meal will be served. After lunch, head to Sarchi, home to a large artisan community, where the most beautiful handicrafts are produced by local artists. While you journey back to your ship you'll pass sugarcane and coffee plantations that were once the main trade of Costa Rica.

Note: Participants must be in good physical condition. Comfortable clothing, walking shoes, a windbreaker and/or rain gear are recommended. At times, clouds may obstruct the view of the crater. Not recommended for those with heart problems, as you'll be ascending to a height of 2,700 feet above sea level.

Carara Tropical Rainforest

Approximate Duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 2

The Carara National Park offers the casual explorer a tremendous insight to the complex world of the tropical rainforest and is ideal for those who wish to become acquainted with the exotic flora and fauna that thrive in the tropics. Over 10,000 species of plants, 300 species of birds and some 200 species of butterflies are present in this transitional zone. Scarlet macaws, howler monkeys, white collared monkeys, coatimundis, peccaries, crocodiles and toucans are a few of the animals that call this area their home. The key to your learning adventure is an experienced naturalist guide, a true master of the forest, who is able to interpret all the messages and signs the jungle puts forth and translates them for you to understand. He will expose the delicate balance between plants, insects and animals and will show you the treasures mother earth gives us.

Note: Travel time is approximately one hour each way. Walking time in the forest will be approximately two hours, under mostly shady areas. Paths used in the forest are over broken terrain and may be muddy. We recommend binoculars, light cotton clothes, long pants, a long sleeved shirt and comfortable walking shoes. Carara is a true biological reserve where animals are free to roam. The large extension of the park allows for animals to chose their habitat and spotting of these animals may not be guaranteed. Participants must be able to walk without assistance.

The beauty of the outrigger canoe is that you share the work of paddling with your group of eight, thus if you feel like sitting back for a while and just looking at the spectacular scenery, you may do so and still continue on your way. Many compare the experience with 'rafting on the ocean'. Besides, as the canoe is fitted with floatation devices on either side, it is virtually unflappable! You'll glide easily past spectacular cliffs with abundant bird life and land on secluded beaches that offer the best snorkeling to be found on the Central Pacific Coast. Once landed, your guide will accompany those who wish to snorkel, making you feel at ease as they point out colorful fish and show you some of the underwater world.

Note: This excursion might operate in reverse order. Please wear casual clothing, comfortable walking shoes, a hat, sunscreen, and bring a camera and raingear. Wildlife sightings while common cannot be guaranteed. Wheelchair restricted participants need to make advance reservations as space is very limited. Ice-cold bottled water will be provided during the train ride. The type of walking required is along even roads and compact gravel trails.

It's home to one of the world's largest crocodile populations in the world with individuals up to 20 feet long that can live up to 60 years. In addition to the crocodiles, over 50 different bird species might be seen on site. The Guacalillo Estuary, famous for its mangrove forests, is one of the nesting sites of the very rare scarlet macaw and a great variety of resident and migrant waterfowls. Your adventure begins with a one hour ride on coastal and countryside roads, passing small towns en route to the Guacalillo Estuary. Once you arrive, a motorized boat will take you through and up the river where you'll be able to observe these wild animals from a safe distance. A delicious tropical fruit buffet will be waiting for you at your return with tropical fruit drinks and coffee. Ample time for purchasing crafts made by local artisans will be given.

Note: Participants must weigh no more than 275 lbs. At the beginning of the exploration, you'll receive a free bird guide for you to be able to identify the birds that you might see. Wear comfortable shoes, long pants, a hat, sunscreen and bring sunglasses, a light jacket/raingear and insect repellent. Walking is over cemented and gravel trails. Advance notice is needed for guests in wheelchairs; nevertheless motorized scooters cannot be handled, only regular wheelchairs.

You'll experience first-hand the coffee roasting process and have the chance to sample the flavorful brewing. Also see how the coffee beans, also known as cherries, are picked, sorted, peeled, fermented and sun-dried. Learn many interesting facts that will change your appreciation for this highly consumed beverage. Feel free to browse the selection of hand-made souvenirs before returning to your ship. The last stop will be at Sarchi to enjoy a delicious typical Costa Rican lunch.

Upon arrival you'll be welcomed and then introduced to the natural spring, which reaches temperatures of 98 to 113 degrees Fahrenheit (37 to 45 degrees Celsius). Take advantage and visit the hot springs on site and prepare to relax. Appreciate the beautiful mountains and lush green flora you are surrounded by while consumed by the natural hot water baths. Machalilla National Park

Start your tour by discovering Ecuador's best-located port: Manta. Your coach takes you through the Malecon, the ocean drive. Continue passing by the new town and new residential areas. Some of the wealthy Ecuadorian exporters and industrialists live here. Then you'll take the circle road that connects to the coastal way south from the city. An approximately two-hour drive will take you to Machalilla National Park. En route, you'll enjoy lovely sceneries of beaches, fishermen's villages and the magic figures of the bottle-shaped kapok trees, characteristic of the tropical dry forest that once stretched along much of the Pacific coast of Central and South America and which has now almost entirely disappeared. Machalilla National Park was created in 1979 to protect about 31 miles of beach, some 98,000 acres of tropical dry forest and cloud forest, and about 49,000 acres of ocean, including two offshore islands, Isla de la Plata and Isla Salango, and the only coral formations found on the Ecuadorian mainland coast. This is the only coastal national park in Ecuador. The number of archaeological sites within and near the park mainly date from the Manta Period, but there are also remains of the much older Machalilla, Chorrera and Salango cultures. You'll visit the small archaeological museum of Agua Blanca, where you can admire artifacts of the Ecuadorian ancient cultures and you'll learn about the burials in the ancient times. It is exactly here, where the oldest relics of human settlement in South America were found. Enjoy an approximately 1 1/2-hour walk in the area and observe colorful birds, several species of mammals and reptiles and unique flora. Fig, laurel and palo santo trees are also commonly seen in this area. Arrive at Playa Los Frailes, one of the most beautiful beaches along the whole South American Pacific coastline. You'll have some free time at the beach to swim and to enjoy your boxed lunch.

Note: Participants must be in good physical condition. Walking is on uneven terrain and the length is approximately two miles. There are 40 steps in Agua Blanca. The boxed lunch is basic due to health department regulations.

These particular hats are proudly made in Ecuador, not in Panama. Here, you'll see how the artisans using 'paja toquilla', a special straw obtained from certain palms of the Ecuadorian coast, knit these special hats. You might want to take one home as a souvenir of your visit. Continuing with the tour, your next stop will be at La Pila. After the discovery of archeological figurines from the ancient Ecuadorian cultures, the

Fine Panama Hats & More

This afternoon you'll enjoy a tour through the authentic area of Manta and its hidden treasures of handicraft skills. After an approximately six mile drive, you'll arrive to the small village that specializes in the production of sisal rugs and bags. El Chorillo is particularly interesting because it is not a tourist spot so the people who live there are willing to share their skills with the visitors. After a 15-minute drive, you'll arrive to a ranch where 'mantenos' will show you the complete steps of the elaboration of the Panama Hats. You'll see how once the fiber is obtained from a plant that grows only in tropical areas, has to be boiled for some minutes to be softened. After letting it dry for some hours in the shade, the weaving begins. The finer the hat is, the longer it is going to take to work on it. In order to have a fine hat ready, the producers will weave at least for three months. Once the weaving is done, the hats will get their shapes by ironing them and finally their traditional black bands. You'll learn as well, how to roll them and pack them in a balsa-wooden box. Free time will be allowed to get pictures and if you wish, to get a 'super fino' hat directly from the producers.

Bahia & Isla Corazon

On your approximately two hour drive to Bahia de Caraquez, you'll see plantations of bananas, rice, onions, and mangos, as well as a dry forest. You'll pass by a shrimp farm and your guide will tell you about this product, so important to the Ecuadorian economy. Back to Bahia, you'll visit the city's Museum of Archaeology with its exhibits from the different cultures that settled in the lowlands thousands of years ago. In the afternoon, you'll return to the pier.

You'll arrive at a 'trapiche', a mill used to obtain the juice of the sugar cane that is processed into a liquor. Afterwards, a local artisan will explain the elaboration of the 'panama hat'. Then, you'll enjoy a delicious coastal lunch in the hosteria. On your way back to the pier you'll make a photo stop at Playa Linguiqui.

Treasures, Temples & Horses

Approximate Duration: 7 ½ hours

Begin with a drive through the Pueblo Libre district to the National Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology, which exhibits evidence of all cultures of pre-Columbian civilizations. Then, drive through the residential districts of San Isidro and Miraflores to take the Panamerican Highway towards the Pachacamac Pilgrimage Center, built by a pre-Incan civilization around 700 A.D. as a temple of the Sun God. The four-square-mile city is divided into two parts: sacred and temporal. The Temple to the God of Creation was the largest structure and contained altars for sacrificial ceremonies. Traces remain of vivid frescoes that decorated the interior, and evidence shows that doors were elaborately inlaid with turquoise, coral and rock crystal. Situated in an extremely arid climate, the adobe buildings remained in astonishingly good condition until a freak storm in the 1920s caused massive erosion. Still impressive, these ruins will evoke vivid images of the people and culture that once inhabited them. Continue to one of the most important Peruvian Paso horse breeder ranches in the country, where you'll learn

about the Peruvian Paso, or stepping horses. This uniquely gaited horse is bred only in Peru. Drive through the residential districts of San Isidro and Miraflores, and stop at Parque del Amor for a magnificent view of the Pacific Ocean and its beaches. After lunch at Casa Hacienda Moreyra, continue to the residential district of Miraflores to view Enrico Poli's private collection. Visit the most representative places of Colonial Lima. Begin at San Marcos University, founded in 1551 as the first university in America. Then drive to the Jesuit convent of San Pedro, jewel of Peruvian Baroque. Continue to the historical district of Rimac where you'll be able to view the beautiful Colonial constructions of 'Paseo de Aguas' and 'Alameda de los Descalzos.' Proceed to Casa Aliaga, America's best-preserved Colonial mansion and in continuous occupancy by the same family since 1535. Cocktails and hors d'oeuvres will be served while visiting the mansion followed by a gourmet lunch before returning to the pier.

Ancient Treasures

Approximate Duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 1

Archaeologists are still accumulating evidence to describe all of the many ancient cultures of Peru, their relationships to each other, and the reasons for their decline from power. This informative excursion takes you to two of Lima's outstanding museums. Drive through the residential districts of San Isidro and Monterrico to visit the renowned Gold Museum and admire its priceless pre-Columbian gold artifacts. Also, visit the Rafael Larco Herrera Museum, housed in an 18th-century Colonial mansion, where an immense and invaluable collection of pottery has been assembled from all the known Peruvian cultures. Reconstructed gravesites show burial techniques. There is a small cactus garden, and a separate room with an extensive collection of erotic art on pottery. An exhibit of textiles made from feathers, and a Paracas weaving that contains 398 threads to the linear inch – possibly a world record – rounds out this collection.

Highlights of Lima

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 1

This tour gives you an overview of Lima and lets you explore Plaza Mayor, designated as the center of the city by Lima's founder, Spanish conquistador Francisco Pizarro, in 1535. Although city planning was uncommon then, he laid out 117 blocks in neat rectangles on the south bank of the Rimac River, a plan that still works today. As you stroll around this attractive square with your guide, you'll see the Government Palace and City Hall. Visit the cathedral, where you'll see the gold casket bearing Pizarro's remains, see the Archbishop's Palace and visit the striking 17th-century Monastery of San Francisco. Note the impressive architecture of this Colonial city, including beautiful wooden balconies. Continue through the fashionable residential districts of San Isidro and Miraflores. A brief stop will be made at Parque del Amor before the return to Callao and your ship.

Pachacamac, which means 'the one who ordains the Universe,' is the most ancient Andean Pilgrimage Center in America. As early as 700 A.D., pilgrims arrived there to consult the oracle. Pachacamac allowed the nobles and the peasants to see the past and the future. This archaeological center conserves the mysticism and religiosity of its past. Walking through this site one can feel the magic attraction of a place that will always be sacred. Accompanied by a researcher of Andean myths and cosmic energy, you'll learn how to recognize the subtle energies present here, as well as equilibrate and cleanse your electromagnetic camp. This is a revitalizing experience.

Proceed to the Casona Riva Aguero, built in 1760 and inhabited by the same family until 1944, when its last owner, Peruvian historian Jose de la Riva-Aguero y Osma died. Since 1947, the house has been the Riva Aguero Institute dedicated to the investigation in human sciences. The house still preserves its 19th century furniture as well as the paintings from the Cusco and Quito Schools. Proceed to Casa de Osambela Oquendo, a mansion that was once the family residence of the prosperous banker, shipowner, and Navarro merchant, Don Martin de Osambela. He had the mansion built at the end of the 18th century and with its particular architectural style, this old house is the essence and synthesis of the unpredictable tastes of Lima's inhabitants of yesteryear, along with its amalgam of styles and its legends of grandeur. Presently, the old house is the headquarters of the Centro Cultural Inca Garcilaso de la Vega. Continue to the Casa Solar de Aliaga, America's best preserved Colonial mansion, occupied by the same family since 1535. After this, continue to the Casa Hacienda Moreyra, which is an original mixture of good food and superb service together with history, art and tradition. Enjoy a lunch designed especially to recreate and preserve the flavors and aromas of Colonial Lima. After lunch, visit the Larco Herrera Museum. Housed in an 18th century Colonial mansion, it has one of the most extensive collection of pre-Columbian art in Peru. It contains fine examples of textile work, (one of which has a world record-breaking 398 threads per inch), as well as the tools ancient Peruvians used to produce textiles, metals, huaco ceramics and gold and silver pieces with

semiprecious stones.

Continue to the south east to the Pachacamac Valley to have a light lunch in one of the best local restaurants in the area. Real Felipe Fortress, the Guard of Callao

Approximate Duration: 3 hours

The Real Felipe, the most imposing of all the fortresses built by the Spanish in their American colonies, is located in Callao, Peru's principal port. It was constructed from 1747 as a defense against pirate attacks from corsairs who knew very well that Spanish galleons, loaded with Inca gold, departed from here. The fortress is currently the seat of the Peruvian Army Museum. The Real Felipe has a true aura of history, and the military authorities therefore decided that the location was an ideal place to exhibit the army's different aspects during the past, and from Inca times onward. On the way you'll visit the Naval Museum of Callao and enjoy a panoramic visit of the local villaje of Chucuito.

Ancient Putre

Approximate Duration: 7 ½ hours

Level 3, Meal

Shortly after you leave Arica, your guide will draw your attention to ancient Indian geoglyphs, or depictions on rocks of alpaca, people and birds. Pass by the pre-Inca village of Poconchile, once a resting station en route to the high plateau, and a weigh station used during construction of the Arica-La Paz Railway. You'll also stop at Pukara de Copaquilla, a 12th-century fortress built by the native Indians, restored in 1979 and now a national monument. Further along, near a small stream, lay the ruins of the modest Tambo de Zapahuiria, a resting station on the Inca Road. As the road, lined with high plateau cacti, climbs higher, you'll have an awesome view into the deep and narrow river valley below. Soon, the landscape opens up to a wide valley located under the massive, snow-capped Putre peaks. Perched about 10,000 feet above the sea, the town of Putre was founded in the 16th century by Spanish settlers to provide services for the traffic between the Potosi silver mine and Arica. There's a wealth of interesting Colonial architecture in the oldest part of town, along O'Higgins Street. Explore the town square and the church, built in 1670. Legend says an earlier church was lined in silver and gold before an earthquake destroyed it. Enjoy a light lunch, and then relax on the approximately three-hour return to Arica.

Note: Because of the high altitude, this tour is not recommended for anyone with heart, respiratory or high blood pressure conditions. In the event of inclement weather and/or damaged roads, you'll be unable to view the geoglyphs.

Arica & Environs

Approximate Duration: 3 ½ hours

Level 1

Begin with a drive through Arica's busy town center en route to its most famous spot – El Morro, a high bluff overlooking the sea. Here, Chileans won one of the most decisive battles of the War of the Pacific, claiming Arica from Peru as a result. A small museum with war memorabilia sits in a plaza atop the hill, where you'll also have a beautiful view of the port, the town, the green Azapa Valley and the coast, which extends to the Peruvian border. Continue your journey to the Azapa Valley, where several geoglyphs may be seen in the distance. These unique drawings of human and animal forms were created by Indians scratching the salty surface of the brightly colored rocks. Stop to visit the interesting San Miguel de Azapa Archaeological Museum, which contains a collection of items from pre-Inca cultures dating to 5,000 B.C., and some of the world's oldest mummies. You'll also stop at the Handicraft Village, a copy of the Parinacota Village that contains exhibits of knitted articles, ceramics, pottery, carved stones and other items. On your return to Arica, a stop will be made at the church of San Marcos, a 19th century Gothic edifice at the base of El Morro. This unique building was designed by famed French architect Gustave Eiffel and, except for the wooden doors, is constructed entirely of metal. It replaced an earlier structure built in 1640 that was swept into the sea by a tidal wave.

Man & the Desert

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 2

For almost 10,000 years, man has inhabited this land, framed by the driest desert in the world, the Atacama Desert. Your tour will begin with a visit to Colon Square and San Marcos Church, erected in 1876 in Gothic style to replace the old church, which was swept away by a tidal wave in 1869. Next, you'll head towards Azapa Valley to visit the San Miguel Archaeological Museum, and then see the geoglyphs, one of the most amazing and enigmatic works of the Andean people. These consist of figures made on the hill slopes, either by piling up stones or scratching the surface of the hillside. Continue south on the Pan-American road to the middle of the desert and Pampa Chaca, where Diaz Fleming, one of the greatest sculptors in Chile, has created the impressive Tutelar Figures, an homage to the Andean people. These are composed of two groups: the Ancestors and the Origin of the Ancestry. According to Andean tradition, these people have a divine origin, descending from the Sun and the Moon. You'll stop for refreshments while enjoying Andean folk music before the return to your ship.

Codpa Village

Approximate Duration: 6 ½ hours

Departing from the pier you'll travel south to Codpa Village. On the route through the Atacama Desert, the driest desert in the world, you'll stop to see Presencias Tutelares Sculptures – giant figures by Chilean sculptor, Juan Diaz Fleming. Continuing your trip you'll stop at a viewpoint to see the desert with the Cordillera de Los Andes in the background. Your destination is Codpa Village, which, during the pre-Hispanic period, was the residence of the chief of Altos de Arica who governed the tribes of Socoroma, Putre, Livilcar and Tignamar, among other communities. Codpa is located on the headwaters of the River Vitor, which ensures a supply of extremely pure water. The land is very fertile and produces different kinds of fruits and here you'll have the opportunity to taste their traditional Pintatani wine. Stroll to discover the local architecture and visit the church. Enjoy lunch while musicians perform local music and dances before you return to the pier in Arica.

Olive Route in the Azapa Valley

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 1

Arica lies at the mouth of the Azapa Valley, a green oasis in the middle of the Atacama Desert that produces all kinds of tropical fruits and vegetables, among which its olives are famous for their size and flavor. The olive is one of the major components of the agriculture in Azapa Valley. The first old olive trees were brought by the first Spanish conquistadors and gave rise to one of the best known varieties the 'Azapa brand'. Your first stop will be precisely at one of these 'haciendas' (ranch). Here you'll learn about its irrigation system and the olive selection. Before you leave, you'll have the chance to actually taste different types of olives. You'll then head towards the San Miguel Archaeological Museum, which has a collection of pre-Columbian artifacts and mummies preserved in sand from ages ago, dating back to 5,000 B.C., which makes them the oldest mummies in the world, and unique as the method of preparation was artificial. The tour also includes the Handicraft Village, a copy of the Parinacota Village, exhibiting knitting articles, ceramics, pottery, carved stones, or ocarinas, among other items. Return to town and then to the pier.

Coquimbo, Chile

Tololo Observatory & Elqui Valley

Approximate Duration: 8 hours

Level 2, Meal

This excursion begins with a drive along the Pan-American Highway and Francisco de Aguirre Avenue, where

you'll see marble replicas of classical statues. Continue to the Elqui Valley, a narrow, fertile strip of land in the middle of the desert irrigated by the Elqui River. An approximately one-hour ride will take you to the gates of the Tololo Observatory, which is among the largest astronomical observatories in the Southern Hemisphere, perched 6,592 feet above sea level. This location was cited for having the clearest atmosphere in the world, a great advantage for astronomical research. The observatory was built using American expertise and is manned by a team of astronomers, engineers, technicians and staff from the United States and Chile. It is the U.S. primary site for conducting ground-based optical astronomy in the Southern Hemisphere because its location provides access to skies at high southerly declinations not visible in the continental United States. The principal instruments are the 4-m Victor Blanco telescope and the 4.1 Southern Astrophysical Research. The observatory also has other telescopes. At Cerro Tololo your view of the universe will definitely expand. After visiting the observatory, you'll continue towards Vicuna, the main town in the Elqui Valley, where Gabriela Mistral (a Nobel Prize winner for literature) was born. Lunch at a local restaurant will be followed by a short city tour through the main square, Bauer Tower and the church before returning to your ship.

La Serena & Elqui Valley

Approximate Duration: 8 hours

Level 1, Meal

Driving along the coastal road, you'll have the opportunity to stop for photos of this popular tourist area. Enjoy the views of the beaches, modern buildings, hotels, pubs, discos and restaurants. Driving to La Serena, you'll pass the fishing village of Penuelas, Coquimbo Casino and the old lighthouse that is La Serena's symbol. Visit the Archaeological Museum, which houses a collection of artifacts from the Diaguita and Molle cultures, and see an original moai, one of the ancient statues from Easter Island. After stopping at a local market that features handicrafts, pottery, alpaca clothing and other items, you'll drive to Elqui Valley. The Elqui River carries water from high in the mountains, creating this fertile oasis in the middle of the desert. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant in the nearby town of Vicuna, and then spend some time exploring the town. Visit the main square and see the old city hall and Vicuna's church. Finally, you'll visit a national drink distillery where you'll learn about the making of Pisco, which is produced and bottled in this region. Pisco is achieved through the distillation of wine produced from different grape varieties; visit the cellars and exhibition room of Pisco, followed by a tasting.

Petroglyphs, Vineyards & Tabali Winery

Approximate Duration: 7 hours

Level 2, Meal

Leaving the pier, you'll drive southwards on the Pan-American Highway, going along the coast and admiring beautiful beaches such as La Herradura, Las Tacas, and Guanaqueros. Then, reaching the hills you'll notice the permanent thick fog (camanchaca or coastal clouds), a phenomenon that produces moisture in this area. Continuing inland to the east, you'll be able to see some crops of 'pepino', called sweet cucumber – and the raising of cattle. Proceeding towards the 'Enchantment Valley' and traveling on a country road, you'll observe the great archaeological importance of this valley, being considered an open-air museum of scientific and cultural interest. The 'Molle Culture' and other groups of hunters inhabited this valley from circa 2,000 B.C. until 600 A.D. In this area, it is possible to find an incredible and interesting number of petroglyphs depicting masks, heads with antennae, tiaras, sun symbols, and snake-like and fish-like shapes deeply engraved in rocks. Also, it is possible to see pictographs of lineal drawings, human beings, and other figures in natural paint. You'll also have the opportunity to see the small cup stones or Piedras Tacitas. Then, drive towards the Tabali Winery. Limari is currently Chile's northernmost wine-producing region, although this is likely to change quickly as pioneering winemakers continue to push northward in search of a new viticultural frontier. Tabali has dedicated its architecture and decor to the ancient inhabitants of this land, the Molle and the Diaguita cultures. All this interacts with elements of pre-Columbian cultures and the colors of the landscapes, brown, given by the aridness of the soil, the greenness of the grass, and wild flowers with the spectacular frame of the Andes Mountains. Afterwards, proceed to a local restaurant to have a well-deserved lunch. This place, located at the foot of the Andes Mountain range is a splendid spot to enjoy nature. Finally, drive back to the pier.

Santiago, Wines & Horses

Approximate Duration: 8 ½ hours

Level 1, Meal, Debarck

First, go into the heart of Casablanca Valley. Since 1875, there have been vineyards here, but only since the 1980s was the true potential of the valley discovered. It was determined that the soils and the conditions were in many ways similar to the Napa and Sonoma Valleys in California. You'll visit one of the wineries located in this valley. See the wine-making process and taste some of the wines they produce. Afterwards, drive towards Puro Caballo, where you'll be introduced to the 'huaso' traditions of the country. Learn about the Chilean horse, a pure breed, able to do things that no other horse in the world can do. Then, while enjoying a glass of wine or Pisco sour, witness an exhibition of the skills of the 'duet' in the national sport: the Chilean rodeo. A delicious lunch awaits you in the on-site restaurant, decorated in the traditional rural way. Continue your drive towards Santiago, crossing the Casablanca and Curacavi Valleys. Your city tour covers the most important highlights of historic and modern Santiago, including La Moneda (Presidential Palace). Next, you'll descend to El Plan and by the main feature of this area, the Plaza Sotomayor, dominated by the Naval Headquarters building and the imposing monument to the Heroes of Iquique. Then, you'll cross the historical business center with fine office buildings on narrow streets strung along the edge of the bay. As you drive along Prat Avenue, you'll see majestic, ancient buildings which used to house banks that no longer exist, such as A. Edwards and Cia. and the former Banco de Londres.

Depending on availability, either Casas del Bosque or Vina Mar will be visited. Casas del Bosque is located 44 miles from Santiago, Chile's capital, and 19

miles from the port of Valparaiso. It was conceived in 1993 to be a family boutique winery exclusively oriented to produce high quality wines. Today, Casas del Bosque has approximately 476 productive acres of white vines Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc, and red vines Merlot, Carmenere, Syrah and Pinot Noir. Vina Mar is located in the middle of Casablanca Valley, approximately at 25 miles east of the port of Valparaiso, and 11 miles in a straight line to the shore. Vina Mar takes advantage of this attribute, enhancing the simple and true expression of the fruit-producing special reserve, reserve, and champenoise wines. After visiting one of these wineries, return to Valparaiso, and take a panoramic tour of Vina del Mar, the resort city and Valparaiso.
