## Alexandria, Egypt

Best of Cairo Overnight

Approximate Duration: 2 Days/1 Night

Level 2, Meal

Day 1: Depart from the pier for a journey through desert scenery and reclaimed, cultivated land, reaching the outskirts of Africa's largest city, the legendary Al Qahira, internationally known as the teeming metropolis of Cairo. Sit back, relax and listen as your guide tells you about the history and culture of a timeless land on a journey lasting approximately three hours. Your first stop brings you to the Citadel of Saladin where you'll see panoramic views of the city of Cairo. Driving through the 'City of the Dead' towards the Citadel, the architectural and the surreal surroundings will capture your imagination. Visit the spectacular Alabaster Mosque of Mohamed Ali and continue to Liberty Square, the heart of downtown, where the National Archaeological Museum is situated. Here acquaint yourself with Egypt's ancient history spanning a period of 50 centuries. The museum houses the richest collection of Egyptian antiquities, including the magnificent Tutankhamun collection. Proceed to a leading hotel in Cairo for check-in formalities, lunch and a short siesta. In the early evening depart to the Papyrus institute where the procedure of manufacturing the oldest paper in the world will be demonstrated for you. You'll have some time to shop for your favorite souvenirs before proceeding to the Giza Plateau to attend the English version of the 'Son et Lumiere'. Here seated in front of the Sphinx under a star-studded sky, the Sound and Light performance brings the magnificent history and achievements of the ancient Egyptians to life as the illuminated pyramids and the mysterious Sphinx dominate the surrounding darkness. To end the night, sail on the River Nile, the same timeless waterway traversed by Pharaohs, Queens and Nobles thousands of years ago. Enjoy a sumptuous buffet dinner in elaborate interiors as you glide past Cairo's waterfront landmarks, while a folkloric presentation and belly dancing take place for your entertainment. You'll then drive back to your hotel for a well-earned night's sleep.

Day 2: After breakfast and check-out, drive south to Egypt's first capital, Memphis. Here visit the ruins of the Temple of Ptah, the fallen colossal statue of King Ramses the 2nd, and the Alabaster Sphinx of King Amenophis the 2nd. Drive to the oldest, ancient cemetery of Sakkara and see the Step Pyramid of King Zoser. Continue to one of the Mastabas (tombs) built nearby, and visit ones such as those of Ptah-Hotep, Mereruca, Idut or Ti. Then proceed to the Giza Plateau, where the only remaining Wonder of the Ancient World is found, the imposing Pyramids of Giza. You'll have some free time at the pyramids to explore and enjoy this magnificent site as well as having unique photo opportunities. Continue down the valley where the mighty Sphinx bears witness to the passage of time. Let your imagination reflect on the golden days of the Pharaohs as you gaze at this mighty monument. Lunch will be served afterwards at a leading hotel nearby the pyramids before the return journey to port. Bring back with you wonderful memories to reflect upon for a very long time to come.

**Note:** Shoulders and knees must be covered and shoes must be removed while visiting the mosque. Visitors must go through two security check points before visiting the Cairo Museum. During the Sound and Light show, use of video cameras requires a fee of approximately \$6.00. All meals and overnight accommodations are included. The drive to Cairo takes approximately 3 hours each way. The sequence may vary but all sites will be visited.

Camel & Jeep Safari

Approximate Duration: 13 hours

Level 2, Meal

Upon arrival at Cairo, you'll proceed to the Giza Plateau where the only remaining wonders of the ancient world, the Pyramids of Giza still stand. Enjoy panoramic views from the Western Plateau, and then stop at the middle pyramid where you can explore the site on your own. Continue down the valley to visit the mighty mysterious Sphinx. Drive through rural areas towards the awaiting four-wheel drive air-conditioned jeep that will take you for

a drive into the desert, towards where a camel caravan is waiting for you. Experienced camel drivers will lead your camel on a trip in the desert in caravan formation. Feel the desert wind in your hair and sway to the motion of your camel as it strides in a leisurely pace through the beauty of a desolate and harsh environment. After a country club-style lunch, continue south through verdant countryside to the oldest cemetery, Sakkara. The world's first monumental stone building, the Step Pyramid of King Zoser, built almost 5,000 ago, still stands here. After visiting the complex, continue to one of the funerary chambers built nearby, to visit one of them. A short stop at a papyrus institute will introduce you to the process of paper-making from reeds, an art discovered by the ancient Egyptians. Limited time will be allocated for souvenir shopping before the return drive to Alexandria.

Pyramids & Nile in Style

Approximate Duration: 12 hours

Level 2, Meal

Your first stop is at the Giza Plateau. Here, the great pyramids stand majestically as a reminder of great times past. You'll enjoy some free time near the Pyramid of Chephren to explore the site on your own. Continue down the valley to visit the guardian of this mortuary complex, the mighty Sphinx. Then, it's on to the banks of the River Nile where a luxurious cruise boat awaits to take you on a ride down the same timeless waterway traversed by Pharaohs, Queens and Nobles thousands of years ago. Enjoy a sumptuous buffet lunch as you glide past Cairo's waterfront landmarks and are entertained by a folkloric presentation and belly dancing. Then, a drive on the New Ring Road will bring you to your next stop, the Citadel of Saladin, where you'll take-in panoramic views of the city of Cairo. At the citadel, visit the spectacular Alabaster Mosque of Mohamed Ali, the founder of modern Egypt. Your last stop will be at a papyrus institute where you'll learn the ancient art of paper making and take advantage of some free time to check out the many souvenirs available.

**Note:** The drive to Cairo takes approximately 3 hours each way.

Classic Cairo

Approximate Duration: 12 ½ hours

Level 2, Meal

After a stop at the Giza Plateau to take in the breathtaking views of the Pyramids, your tour continues to visit the Sphinx, the mysterious guardian of the desert. Later, take time to relax and enjoy a delicious lunch buffet at a leading hotel. After lunch, drive to Tahrir (Liberty) Square, the heart of downtown Cairo. Visit the National Archaeological Museum and acquaint yourself with Egypt's ancient history. The museum is the repository of the world's largest and richest collection of Egyptian antiquities, amongst them the priceless collection of King Tutankhamun. Continue to a papyrus institute where the art of paper making from reeds, discovered by the Ancient Egyptians, will be demonstrated for you, followed by some free time for souvenir shopping.

**Note:** The drive to Cairo takes approximately 3 hours each way.

Cairo, Pyramids & Tombs

Approximate Duration: 12 ½ hours

Level 2, Meal

After driving from Alexandria to the teeming metropolis of Cairo, you'll stop in Memphis, Egypt's first capital. Here you'll visit the ruins of the temple of Ptah, the statue of King Ramses the 2<sup>nd</sup>, and the Alabaster Sphinx of King Amenhopis the 2<sup>nd</sup>. A short drive from Memphis lays the oldest cemetery of Sakkara. After visiting the complex, continue to one of the Mastabas (funerary chambers) built nearby, such as those of Ptah-Hotep, Mereruca, Idut or Ti for an inside visit. A sumptuous buffet lunch waits at a deluxe hotel where you'll have some time to relax before the drive to the Giza Plateau where the only remaining wonder of the ancient world, the Pyramids of Giza lay. Enjoy panoramic views from the Western Plateau, and then stop at the middle pyramid where you can explore the site on your own. Continue down the valley to visit the guardian of this mortuary complex, the mighty Sphinx, watching the passage of time and men in eons of silence. An orientation drive through Cairo culminates your day before returning to your ship in Alexandria. At the end of the day a short stop will take place at a papyrus institute where you'll see how paper was made from reeds by the ancient Egyptians. Limited time for shopping is also included.

**Note:** The drive to Cairo takes approximately 3 hours each way.

The Best of Alexandria

Approximate Duration: 8 ½ hours

Level 2, Meal, Age Requirements

Founded by Alexander the Great in 332 B.C. Alexandria is the shining pearl of the Mediterranean. Immortalizing Alexander's name, the city flourished beyond all expectations into a prominent cultural, intellectual and economic metropolis, the remains of which are still evident to this day. Take a drive through colorful streets viewing beautiful architecture and experiencing the charming aura and nostalgia of yesteryear. The equestrian bronze statue of Mohamed Ali, founder of modern Egypt, decorates Mansheya Square. A few steps away is the elegant marble edifice dedicated to the Unknown Soldier, its guards of honor at attention on either side. Your first stop will be at the eerie and intriguing Catacombs of Shawqafa, an extensive three-level funerary complex dating from the 2nd century A.D. Continue to the National Museum housing underwater photographs and statues from the ongoing operation to salvage artifacts from the identified sunken palace of Cleopatra. After lunch at one of the city's leading restaurants, drive to Bibliotheca Alexandrina, inaugurated in 2002 on the same site where the famous Library of Alexandria was. The building was designed to be one of the unique and most unusual architectural structures of the modern world, reflecting the architectural genius of the 21st century. Your tour will be conducted by the library's own guides. You'll also visit the library's Archaeological Museum. A scenic drive on the beachfront boulevard of Alexandria will bring you to the famous Montaza Gardens where you'll find the summer residence palace of the late ex King Farouk. Take a stroll through the palm-covered grounds and view the palace, still used today by the present government for official state functions. On the return to your ship, short photo stops will be made at Qait Bey Fort, built on the original site of the Pharaohs, Alexandria's ancient lighthouse which was one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, and Abu El Abbas Mosque, one of Alexandria's Islamic landmarks characterized by its tall minarets and four domes.

Alexandria Highlights

Approximate Duration: 5 hours

Level 2, Age Requirements

Depart from the pier for a drive through the colorful streets of Alexandria viewing beautiful architecture and experiencing the charming aura and nostalgia of yesteryear. Discover the highlights of Alexandria; the statue of Mohamed Ali, the monument to the Unknown Soldier, the Mosque of Abu El Abbas, and stop for a picture of Qait Bey Fort, built on the site of the Pharaohs of Alexandria. Continue to visit the eerie and intriguing Catacombs of Shawqafa and the National Museum, where treated and restored objects from the sunken palace of Cleopatra are on display. Enjoy a scenic drive to Montaza Gardens to view the summer residence palace of the former King of Egypt, Farouk. Driving along the cornice will give you panoramic views of Alexandria from the water's edge.

**Note:** Children under the age of 6 are not permitted in the Alexandria Library.

El Alamein

Approximate Duration: 6 ½ hours

Level 2

Your tour takes you along the Egyptian coastline, considered as one of the most beautiful areas along the shores of the Mediterranean from Alexandria, and to the small village of El Alamein, set in a broad and barren desert plain somehow too distant from the seafront. It was here in November 1942 that the Allied forces, under the command of British General Montgomery, put a halt to the advance of Nazi Africa Corps who considered El Alamein the gateway to Alexandria and the key to the control of the African continent. Your first stop will be at the Military Museum containing displays of weapons, military garb and tanks. Descriptions of the actions of Montgomery, Rommel and the others participating in the battle are also on display. Continue your tour with a visit to the burial site. A short drive west of town, perched on a small peninsula overlooking the sea, the citadel-like cemeteries are the final resting place for Commonwealth, Italian and German soldiers. The neat rows of tombstones provide a poignant scene set against the seemingly interminable desert. Within a shaded alcove, the inscribed plaque explains the significance of the battle as well as the diverse origins of the victims interred here.

## Athens (Piraeus), Greece

Legendary Delphi

Approximate Duration: 9 hours

Level 3, Meal

After the Acropolis, Delphi is the most popular archaeological site in Greece. With its exquisite setting on a mountain terrace dwarfed by the ominous crags of Mt. Parnassus, Delphi was one of the most important sanctuaries of ancient Greece and held to be the center of the earth. Walk along the Sacred Way to the Temple of Apollo, see the treasuries, the place of offerings, the Grand Temple of Apollo and the theater with its splendid acoustics. Then visit the Delphi Museum, which houses many of the treasures recovered from the site, including Omphalos, which marked the center of the world, and the famous Charioteer, one of the finest pieces surviving from the 5th century B.C. You'll enjoy a taste of authentic Greek cuisine at a local restaurant in the exquisite setting of Delphi. The return drive takes you past Thebes, Levedia and the sacred Castilian spring near the sanctuary of Apollo.

Athens & Its Scenic Coast

Approximate Duration: 8 ½ hours

Level 3, Meal

This excursion is an ideal introduction to the city's highlights. Reach the natural fortress of the Acropolis, and with your guide you'll walk up the uneven footpath heading to the summit. Sights include the Propylaea, Temple of Aterios Niki, Erechtheum and the Architectural Triumph of the Parthenon. Continue with a city drive and see Constitution Square, the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Royal Palace, Hadrian's Gate and the Old Marble Olympic Stadium. After lunch, drive along the scenic coastal road which affords splendid views of the Saronic Gulf and takes you through some of Athens' most beautiful suburbs. Arrive at Cape Sounion to visit the Temple of Poseidon, standing some 200 feet above the sea at the edge of a cliff. It is one of the most breathtaking and deeply moving sights in all of Greece. Fifteen of the original 34 columns of the Doric order still stand in majestic splendor.

**Note:** The Acropolis is explored on foot and requires approximately two hours of walking. There are some 75 steps at the entrance and in certain locations the marble is uneven and slippery. We advise that you bring a bottle of water and suitable sun protection. This tour may be slightly shortened during winter months due to the time in port.

Ancient Treasures

Approximate Duration: 7 ½ hours

Level 3, Meal

After a visit to the Acropolis and its famous landmarks, your tour takes you on a scenic drive through the highlights of Athens. Admire the Propylaea, the temple of Aterios Niki, the Erechtheum, and stand in awe in front of the Parthenon. You'll then have some free time to wander around the old district, Plaka. Then take a drive passing by numerous points of interest and the best-known city landmarks before arriving at your lunch venue. After, visit the National Archaeological Museum, housing an unrivaled collection of treasures of Cycladic, Minoan, Mycenaean, and Classical Greek Art. A few of the museum's most important exhibits include the bronze statue of Poseidon,

Head of Hygeia (Goddess of Health), bronze statue of the 'Jockey-Boy' of Artemision, Golden Mask of Agamemnon and brilliant Minoan-style frescoes from Thira (Santorini). Following your visit to the museum, you'll return to your ship in Piraeus.

A Taste of Athens

Approximate Duration: 6 hours

Level 3

Drive through the picturesque marinas of Zea and Microlimano in Piraeus as your tour heads to the center of Athens. You'll have the opportunity to admire some of the most important sites of Athens, such as Constitution Square, the Monument of the Unknown Soldier, Temple of Zeus, Royal Palace, and the Old Marble Olympic Stadium. The Acropolis is one of the most photographed and recognizable hills in the entire world. Sights include the Propylaea, Temple of Apteros Niki, Erechtheum and Architectural Triumph of the Parthenon. Afterwards, you'll have free time to wander around the picturesque streets of Plaka, the old preserved district of Athens with numerous art and craft shops, restaurants and cafes. You'll have plenty of free time for shopping or to independently enjoy Greek specialties at one of the traditional colorful taverns. After your wanderings at the old district of Athens, board your coach from a designated point at a set-up time for your return to the pier.

Beyond, on the highest part of the hill, stands the crowning glory of the Acropolis, the Parthenon, looking out over the graceful Temple of Athena Nike, the Erechtheion and the Old City below. You'll pass the statue of Lord Byron, the Corinthian Temple of Olympian Zeus and Constitution Square to the former Royal Palace. Here you'll have a chance to take a photo of the Presidential Guard or Evzones in traditional uniform, as they stand watch over the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Other sights on the drive include the Academy, National Gardens and the Old Marble Olympic Stadium, built in 1895 for the first modern Olympic Games.

A Visit to Argolis

The greatest concentration of ancient sites in Greece is found on the little peninsula of Argolis. After departing from the pier on an approximately one-hour drive along the highway, you'll pass by the Corinth Canal. Your first stop is at the ancient site of Mycenae. The first in-depth excavations here were carried out by the German archaeologist Schlieman in 1876 who was obsessed with finding the grave of King Agamemnon. His diligent work exposed the famous Lions Gate, the entrance to the city which contains the shaft burial graves of some ancient nobles. A short distance away is the Beehive Tomb, so called due to its unusual shape. At the end of the guided tour of Mycenae, you'll enjoy lunch at a local area restaurant. Following lunch, proceed to Epidaurus known for its stunning ancient theater. One of the most important sanctuaries in the ancient world, Epidaurus was dedicated to the God of Medicine, Asklepios. The world-famous Theatre of Epidaurus, built in the 4th century B.C. is a marvel of harmony and acoustics and the best preserved ancient theater in Greece. Built in limestone, the theater seats 12,000 spectators. After your visit to Epidaurus, you'll reboard your coach and return to your ship in Piraeus.

Today it is the most important recreational area in Barcelona. Drive by the Olympic Ring and make a brief stop at the Mirador del Alcalde for a panoramic view of the city. Finally, arrive at the Gothic Quarter for a walking visit. The facade of the cathedral and octagonal dome are Neo-Gothic structures of the 19th century, designed according to a 15th-century drawing. From here, you'll be dropped off at an NCL program hotel, Catalunya Square or continue to the airport.

Mount Filerimos & Rhodes Town

First-time visitors to Rhodes are sure to enjoy this overview of essential sites. Drive along the west coast of the island before taking a winding road inland to the plateau of Filerimos, nearly 1,000 feet above sea level. Here stands the Church of Our Lady, built upon the foundations of the ancient Temple of Athena and the catacombs of early Christian times. The church was restored by the Knights of St. John and used as stables by the Turks before being rebuilt a little over 30 years ago. The restored monastery is still occupied, and the barrel-vaulted Chapel of St. George has some noteworthy 15th century frescoes. Back in Rhodes, your walking tour of the old walled town begins. Lining its stone-paved lanes are grand Medieval structures, each recalling the Knights of St. John and their Turkish conquerors. Your guide recounts the town's fascinating past as you walk along the Knights Road, one of the town's oldest and most magnificent thoroughfares. Built along the route of an ancient street dating back

to 408 B.C., the road leads to the Palace of the Grand Masters, a fortress deliberately built to dominate the town and the harbors. The floors are covered with ancient mosaics from the island of Kos while an impressive marble staircase leads to the upper floor. From this level you'll have panoramic views over the city of Rhodes. Adding to the vitality of the old town, there are many inviting shops, giving a modern touch to the Medieval picture. Your tour concludes back at the pier.

The Acropolis of Lindos

The ancient Doric town of Lindos lies on a rocky promontory 30 miles south of Rhodes town on the island's east coast. This scenic drive passes orange and lemon groves, prosperous vineyards and gnarled olive trees. As your motorcoach makes the last bend of the road, the views of Lindos are fabulous; impressive rocky cliffs rise 400 feet from the sea dominating the town's two harbors. The imposing temple standing high above a sheer cliff dominates the town, and the striking site of the acropolis surrounded by the blue seas attracts artists from around the world. Below lies the Medieval fort and village clustered with pretty white houses and its streets paved with intricately patterned black and white pebbles collected from the sea. There is a 20-minute climb through the narrow streets of the town and another 250 steps up to the temple, so this climb is not for everyone, but very rewarding for the physically fit. Once you arrive to the top, explore ancient sites of the last conquerors including the 4th century B.C. Doric Temple of Athena Lindia with its double-winged portico. Also highlighting the acropolis is a Byzantine church, and the remains of the castle-citadel of the Knights of St. John. From the summit there are great views of the fishing harbor of Psarto, where tradition says St. Paul landed. After browsing through the village with its small shops, brimming with attractive souvenirs, return to the harbor in Rhodes by the same route.

Upon arrival, you'll proceed to your jeep and set off on a trip around the island to discover the hidden charms of Gozo. The main stops during the safari include Ggantija – the most impressive monument of European prehistory, Dwejra – a superb natural phenomenon, Xlendi, and the capital Victoria. Your guide will give brief explanations at the various sites, however, during the safari, no commentary will be made as you'll simply enjoy the scenery. A small snack will be included and if the weather permits, you can take a swim in the Mediterranean Sea.

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 2, Age Requirements

Today, experience the thrill of Scuba diving under the supervision of a PADI professional. **Note:** Participants must be at least 10 years of age. All participants are required to sign a PADI Medical and Liability form prior to starting the course. If a student has any of the medical conditions listed, then a PADI Medical Statement and Divers Medical Questionnaire must be completed and signed by a physician familiar with contraindications to Scuba diving and must be valid within the past 12 months – this cannot be done on the cruise ship. All divers will have to complete a registration form upon arrival at the dive center. This will include details of diving qualifications and a copy of a medical declaration. Every diver is required to sign a Self Declaration Medical form prior to starting any Scuba diving activities.

Ultimate Malta

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 2, Ultimate Touring

Experience Malta in a small group and gain an insight into its history on this ultimate tour. Begin with a drive through the Three Cities – Senglea, Cospicua and Vittoriosa. Left largely unvisited, the Three Cities are a slice of authentic life, and a glimpse into Malta's maritime fortunes. The Three Cities can rightly claim to be the cradle of Maltese history. Embark traditional Maltese 'Dghajsas' (boats) for an approximately 30-minute trip within the harbor. There will be approximately five passengers per boat. Continue with a drive to the capital city, Valletta, for a visit of St. John's Co-Cathedral and its famous painting by Caravaggio – The Beheading of St. John. Finally, you'll walk to Casa Rocca Piccola, home of the 9th Marquis and Marchioness de Piro where you'll be met by the owners of the house today. The value of Casa Rocca Piccola lies in its ability to provide unique historical evidence into the customs and traditions of the Maltese nobility over the last 400 years. You can also see a collection of furniture, silver, and paintings that add to the aesthetic riches of this country. If the weather is nice, you'll enjoy tea, coffee, and fresh cannoli in the courtyard before returning on your minibus back to the ship.

Learn of the mysteries of the Stone Age temples to the coming of the Romans and Arabs, the rule of the knights to the wartime spirit that captured the imagination of the world. During the show, a gripping commentary brings Malta's history to life.

Exclusive Malta's Scenic Beauty

Leaving the Blue Grotto, you'll drive through Girdgħi, which houses the summer residence of the Prime Minister, reaching Buskett Gardens, on to Dingli Cliffs. At Dingli Cliffs you can admire the view from Malta's highest point. Departing the cliffs, you'll then drive through Rabat around the perimeter of Mdina, Malta's old capital city. Continue your drive through Mosta known for its famous dome before heading back to your ship.

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 3, Age Requirements, Ultimate Touring

You will depart quay-side accompanied by a local Escort and drive to Dingli. First you'll receive an introduction to the Segway. You'll be individually instructed on how to ride the Segway and then practice forward and backwards control and turning. Next you'll explore Dingli Village and continue on towards Buskett. A winding track towards Buskett ends this session and ensures all turning and maneuvering skills have been mastered. After a short break, you'll have the chance to increase the maximum speed of the Segway to see how well it handles hills and slopes. Explore the natural beauty of the park before heading to Dingli Cliffs stopping next to the cart ruts / tracks and next to Girgenti Palace.
