Tour Indicators/Symbols

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 1, Family Recommended, Guests with Disabilities

Your professional driver/guide will provide you with lively narration and share the unique history of Ketchikan as you drive along the scenic Tongass Narrows en route to Totem Bight State Park, home to one of the world's largest stand of totems. Immerse yourself in the beauty of the Tongass National Rainforest under the canopy of majestic hemlock and cedar trees. At the end of the trail you'll be impressed by the large collection of totem poles that your driver/guide will bring to life for you. Through entertaining stories and narrative you'll learn about the culture and lifestyles practiced by the northwest coastal Natives and have a chance to enter into an authentic Native clan house. During your brief stop at the quaint Alaska Totem Trading store, you'll have an opportunity to shop and view beautifully carved totems along with a collection of vintage automobiles. Returning to town, catch a glimpse of Ketchikan's colorful past as you drive past Creek Street, the historic red light district. Finally, it's time to enjoy the 'The Great Alaskan Lumberjack Show'! Hardy lumberjacks gather in this partially covered and heated outdoor arena, to compete in various logging events for you. Crowd favorites like log rolling, ax-throws and speed-climbing events will bring the audience alive as you cheer your lumberjack on. Many World Champion athletes, as seen on ESPN and the Travel Channel, spend their summers in Ketchikan and will be performing in this great show.

Note: Please note that there may be a short wait prior to the Lumberjack Show. Time can be spent on your own or in the rustic company store located at the Lumberjack Show. Tour may operate in reverse.

lumberjack competition on this comprehensive tour of Ketchikan. Your first stop will be a visit to Saxman Native Village. For generations, Tlingit villages have maintained a tradition of welcoming visitors in regal style. At Saxman, guests are still afforded this same time-honored welcome. In this Native community, tribal elders and others have worked hard to pass on many of the traditions that have long defined the culture of Southeast Alaska. A visit to Saxman gives the visitor a firsthand opportunity to see the results of these efforts. A short video program introduces the visitor to the culture and history of Saxman. Guests then enter the Beaver Clan House where they are welcomed by song and dance. Visitors are encouraged to participate in the final dance before moving onto the Saxman Totem Park, one of the largest gatherings of totem poles in the world. Your guide will help unravel the mysteries of these towering, majestic poles that stand as sentries over the present generation. The next stop is the Village Carving Center where world famous carvers work and pass on their skills to eager apprentices. A visit to the Village Store provides guests with the opportunity to purchase some of the finest Alaska Native art available or a small memento of your visit. On the return trip, see sights of Creek Street and let the fun begin with a stop at the Great Alaska Lumberjack Show. Hardy lumberjacks bring to life Alaska's colorful forest history with an action packed competition in the partially covered and heated outdoor arena. Cheer on your team of World Champion lumberjacks in events such as chopping, sawing, tree climbing and much more. You'll be kept on the edge of your seats as the entertaining host relives rich logging tales of a bygone era.

Nature Sanctuary, Eagle Center & Totems

Approximate Duration: 2 ¾ hours

Level 1, Raingear, Family Recommended

A coastal drive takes you to the Alaska Rainforest Sanctuary, a private reserve located in the forested mountains in rustic Herring Cove. This pristine natural environment is home to several species of wildlife, attracted by the major salmon runs in the abundant marine estuary. You'll be greeted by your naturalist and guided along an improved trail through the heart of the dense forest, amongst tall stands of hemlock, spruce and Alaska cedar. Your guide will lead you to a protected open estuary, where you follow Eagle Creek along an elevated wooden boardwalk overlooking grassy wetlands. During the spawning season, bears and seals feed on salmon returning to this pristine environment. If you like nature, you'll love this tour. At the conclusion of the 1/2-mile trail hike, you'll have an opportunity to interact with, feed, and photograph Alaskan reindeer. Also, see bald eagles up-close at the Alaska Wildlife Foundation. After observing these gentle creatures, you'll be guided through the historic Herring Bay Lumber Company sawmill, established by legendary pioneer Ben Fleenor, and visit a master Native totem pole carver at work. Explore and learn about this renowned site and receive a sample of aromatic local Alaskan cedar.

Note: Wear comfortable walking shoes and warm clothing. This tour operates in all weather conditions. Rain ponchos are provided if needed. Wildlife sightings are not guaranteed and are more frequent in midsummer.

Lighthouse, Totems & Eagles Excursion

Approximate Duration: 3 hours

Level 1, Family Recommended

This excursion guarantees excellent eagle viewing. Majestic totems and a waterfront clan house demonstrate the historical Native culture at Totem Bight State Park. Get a close-up view of Guard Island Lighthouse. Enjoy a short narrated drive through Ketchikan en route to meet your Captain and Alaskan crew. Board your vessel, where you'll hear professional narration, while you munch on salmon spread, cheese, crackers, fresh fruit, and cookies. Hot chocolate, coffee, tea, water, or soft drinks are all free. Relax in the heated main cabin or experience the open-air observation deck. Observe the areas of harvest and ancient old growth, and learn of the historical and modern uses of this very special temperate rainforest and its complex ecosystem. Cruise by historic Ward Cove Cannery and Loggerville, Alaska's only 'floating town.' One half of this tour features the Revillagigedo Island waterfront with its homes of the local 'rich and famous,' while the remainder explores the remote Guard Island and primitive Gravina Island. Binoculars are provided for your use. Eagles of course, are guaranteed and we usually see harbor seals and abundant moon jellyfish. Whales, deer, blue heron and a variety of gulls and sea birds are also common.

Note: We recommend you bring a warm, rainproof jacket to wear on the observation deck.

Best of Ketchikan by Land & Sea

Approximate Duration: 3 ½ hours

Level 2, Family Recommended

Experience Ketchikan's rich maritime history, Native culture and breathtaking wilderness surroundings, by land and sea. Your driver/guide will fill you in on historic Creek Street, where homes and shops are perched over the water on wooden pilings. At Saxman Village, you'll stop to view one of the world's largest gatherings of totem poles, as your guide interprets the meanings of these giant sentries, which border the park and entrance to the Beaver Clan House. Continue to George Inlet, where a relaxing stroll through the rainforest brings you to the historic Libby Cannery. Beginning with a short video, this fascinating tour will take you back to the days when rugged men and women toiled day and night to harvest and process the abundant Alaska salmon. From the cannery dock, you'll board a water jet-powered vessel to explore the coastline of glacier-carved George Inlet, while the onboard naturalist explains the natural history of southeast Alaska. Eagles, seals, porpoises, and other species of wildlife are often sighted; the Captain will maneuver the boat to give the best possible views.

Your colorful host, 'Jack Pine Jan,' will referee this rowdy competition and tell the tales of the often hostile work environment found in the Tongass Rainforest. You'll be comfortable in covered and heated grandstands that are just a short walk from the cruise ship pier. Experience the local wildlife...the Alaskan Logger...in this rip-roaring good time celebration of a bygone era.

Wilderness Exploration & Crab Feast

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 1, Meal, Raingear, Family Recommended

Explore Alaska's wilderness by boat and savor Dungeness crab amid the hospitality of a historic Alaska lodge. At George Inlet Lodge, board your vessel and cruise the Inside Passage waterway on a journey that explores the region's history and natural beauty. On your journey up the fjord, you'll pass the old George Inlet Cannery, and Mahoney River Valley which is home to bears, eagles, and salmon that return to spawn annually. Cross the fjord and view the Tongass National Forest in its entire splendor. A remote cove is home to Dungeness crab. Volunteers help pull crab pots, and while these crabs are set free, you'll have the opportunity to see them up-close and learn about their anatomy and lifecycle. Once the pots are reset, return to the lodge for a well-deserved meal that includes a beverage, oriental salad, steamed baby red potatoes, one full serving of Dungeness crab, and a slice of cheesecake smothered in Alaskan blueberries!

Note: Rain ponchos will be provided when needed for the boat portion of the tour. You must be able to navigate 70 stairs to get up to the lodge and boat ramp. There are resting stations along the way – every 15 or 20 steps.

Level 1, Meal, Age Requirements, Raingear, Family Recommended

This is why you came to Alaska: to experience an authentic fishing excursion in the unspoiled wilderness of Alaska's coastline where you'll cast a line in local fishing hotspots. It's the perfect choice for adventurers or families seeking a personalized tour. With only four passengers per boat, your guides customize the excursion to fit your interests and skill level. Completely outfitted, you'll board a stable 20-foot skiff and head out into the unspoiled wilderness. The thrill of bottom fishing is what attracts fishermen to these waters. Feel the visceral connection with the elements as you work your own rod and tackle to hook the 'big one'. Experience the

excitement of landing rockfish, red snapper, lingcod or halibut – possibly a world-famous salmon. Your catch becomes lunch; we take only what you'll eat. Afterwards, head for shore to a remote wilderness campsite where a crackling fire awaits. As the camp chef prepares your meal, settle into the stillness of the rainforest, or rest on a beach log and enjoy the centuries-old spruce trees and fragrant cedars. Dine on your freshly caught fish served atop a saffron-infused, bouillabaisse-inspired stew (no shellfish). Savor fire-warmed sourdough rolls, rhubarb blueberry bread pudding, and steaming mugs of coffee or hot chocolate.

Note: Participants must be at least 4 years of age and physically active. We recommended that you wear warm, layered clothing. Actual fishing duration varies from two to three hours. Tour requires negotiating uneven terrain and the skiff is open to the elements. Alaska State Law requires a fishing license that can be purchased in cash at the outfitting room for \$20.

Wilderness Guided Fly-Fishing

Approximate Duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 2, Age Requirements, Raingear

*This tour only operates from mid-July to September

Beginners and experts alike will be amazed at the fishing and wilderness experience found at the remote, privately owned White River Valley. Situated in the middle of the Tongass National Forest, this valley, owned by the Cape Fox Indians, boasts excellent fishing in White River. After arriving in the White River Valley and being fully outfitted, your guide will take you to one of their fishing spots. Enjoy the beautiful, natural surroundings as you go fishing for pink, chum, or Coho salmon in the White River. Keep your eyes peeled for the abundant wildlife that the river brings with it. Your guide will tailor their assistance to meet your needs. No experience is necessary.

Note: Participants must be at least 14 years of age. This is 'catch-and-release' fly fishing. This tour only operates from mid-July to September. Fishing location will be guide's choice based on conditions and salmon runs. Actual fishing duration is approximately 3 hours. Alaska State Law requires a fishing license that can be purchased in cash from your tour guide for \$20.

Knudson Cove Salmon Sportfishing

Approximate Duration: 5 hours

Level 2, Age Requirements

Try your Sportfishing skills in the 'Salmon Capital of the World,' with experienced Captains and well-equipped fishing boats, designed to maximize your chances. Each boat features enclosed cabins with space for four to six guests. You'll fish against the backdrop of glacier-carved bays and fjords. The skipper or deckhand will assist and supply you with fishing gear as you troll for salmon using a downrigger. Fish processing and taxidermy services are available for an additional charge.

Note: Participants must be at least 6 years of age. Fishing duration is approximately 3 1/2-4 hours. Participants must wear rubber-soled shoes. Alaska State Law requires a fishing license that can be purchased on the fishing boat for \$20. During king salmon season, you must purchase an additional \$10 tag. You'll need a credit card in order to have your catch processed and sent home (U.S. only). Fish cannot be stored on board the ship.

Misty Fjords & Wilderness Explorer

Approximate Duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 1, Guests with Disabilities, Family Recommended

Explore Misty Fjords – one of nature's most spectacular creations – while cruising in luxury aboard one of the fastest sightseeing vessels in Alaska. Enjoy the service and narrative provided by your crew, and watch for wildlife as the water jet-powered catamaran 'flies' at sea level past rugged coastlines. Voyage into Behm Canal, surrounded by the pristine beauty of Misty Fjords. Stop to view a bald eagle's nest and a Tlingit pictograph. Admire New Eddystone Rock, an immense volcanic spire rising from the sea. You'll explore Rudyard Bay, an ice-carved masterpiece deep within the Monument. Learn the natural history of the fjords while gliding quietly beneath 3,000-foot vertical cliffs. Feel the mist of glistening waterfalls and listen to the call of seabirds nesting on a rock face sculpted by glacial forces. Magnificent Misty Fjords Seaplane

Approximate Duration: 2 hours

Level 1, Guests with Disabilities, Flight, Family Recommended

Board an authentic Alaska floatplane and soar over the nation's second-largest wilderness area, encompassing more than two million acres. Take in the dramatic beauty of a land slowly crafted by the hands of nature. See sheer granite cliffs, 1,000-foot waterfalls, crystalline lakes and low-hanging mists on your flight from Tongass Narrows over Revillagigedo Island to Misty Fjords. At the entrance of spectacular Rudyard Bay, your introduction to the Monument, see New Eddystone Rock, a striking remnant of early geological activity.
