A Mystical Night in Marrakech

Approximate Duration: 2 days & 1 night

Level 2, Meal

It's called the Rose City because of the color of the red clay used for its construction, which gives the city its salmon-pink color. Part Berber, part Arab, part African, Marrakech is the heartbeat of Morocco, a city with labyrinths of mysterious lanes, ornate mansions, exquisite mosques and colorful markets. This intoxicating city is a feast for the eyes, a place where even the refined elements have a roughness to them. Join us for an adventure to the mystical city of Marrakech.

Day one: Depart Casablanca for an approximately four-hour drive across the Chaouia and Ben Guerir plains to the huge, palm-surrounded oasis that harbors Marrakech. Along the way, your guide will tell you about the history and culture of this captivating city as you pass villages and small towns, and mile-upon-mile of rural land. After a refreshment stop, the city of Marrakech unfolds, nestled at the foot of Morocco's mighty Atlas Mountains. You'll travel along boulevards lined with orange and jacaranda trees before checking in at your deluxe hotel. Enjoy a buffet-style lunch around the pool (weather permitting) and time to freshen up before your afternoon exploration of the city. See new and exciting places such as the Menara basin, the 12th-century minaret of Koutoubia – the tallest and most famous landmark in Marrakech, and the Saadian tombs, where the Royal family of the Saadian dynasty is buried. The beautiful Necropolis contains 66 indoor tombs with interiors intricately decorated with mosaics. Walk through the ancient Medina with its colorful souks before arriving at the famous Jamaa el Fna square, where fortune-tellers, magicians, fire eaters and monkey leaders mingle with acrobats, snake charmers and popular singers; undoubtedly, the most exuberant marketplace in the world. Enjoy some free time here to soak in the atmosphere before returning to your hotel where you'll be able to relax for a while before being picked up for some more excitement before the night is over. You'll depart for dinner at a typical Moroccan restaurant under royal tents, with typical folkloric and fantasia horsemen skills show between acts, horsemen race and fire their loud rifles. After the show, you'll return to your hotel for a well-earned rest.

Day two: After a buffet breakfast, another day of touring begins. You'll do some more sightseeing and perhaps some shopping before a visit to the 19th-century Bahia Palace, a great exponent of Moroccan architecture, with its tranquil lush gardens and magnificent decorations, including rooms that were devoted in the past to the ruler's harem. Lunch will be served in the ancient Medina, surrounded by breathtaking architecture and entertainment, including Andalusian music and belly dancing, reminiscent of the life of the 'One Thousand and One Nights' era of Arabian history. Then say goodbye to the city and head to Agadir to meet your ship. Relax and enjoy the views during the four-hour return drive to your ship. A stop will be made on the way for refreshments.

Note: Tour includes all meals, entrance, show and hotel accommodations. Your hotel does not serve alcoholic beverages. Tour not recommended for guests with walking disabilities as there is extensive walking in crowded areas, narrow alleyways and uneven or steep terrain. Roadside bathroom facilities can be very basic. We suggest you bring some tissue paper with you. There is only one bathroom stop during your drive to Marrakech. Space on this tour is limited, we recommend that you book no later than 15 days prior to sailing date as this tour might not be available for booking onboard. Cancellation deadline is 15 days prior to sailing date.

Imperial Rabat & Casablanca

Approximate Duration: 8 hours

Level 2, Meal

Your day starts with an approximately 1 1/2-hour drive to the diplomatic capital of Morocco, Rabat, rich in historical monuments and history. Arriving at the Mechouar Quarter, you'll admire the magnificent exterior of the Royal Palace. Continue to the archaeological site of Chellah. Excavations of this ancient Phoenician city show the remains of the Decumanus Maximus, or principal way, as well as those of a forum, a monumental fountain, a triumphal arch and other important ruins. Drive along the winding road overlooking the Bou Regreg River to



Mohamed V Mausoleum for an inside visit. This is the place where the father of Moroccan independence is buried. You'll also see Hassan Tower, one of the prestigious architectural heritages of the Almohad Dynasty. After lunch at a typical Moroccan restaurant, continue on foot to the ancient medina and its colorful souks to arrive at the Kasbah of Oudaya, a beautiful quiet spot in the middle of busy Rabat. With its white and blue houses that seem freshly painted, is a refreshingly eye-catching spot in the middle of bustling Rabat. Visit the beautiful and tranquil Andalusian Gardens. A soft drink will be offered at the Kasbah's Moorish cafe on the banks of the Bou Reg Reg River which flows into the Atlantic Ocean. Back in Casablanca, you'll have an orientation tour of the city including a photo stop at the Hassan II Mosque, the seaside resort of Ain Diab and if time permits, some time for shopping before the return to your ship.

Casablanca Highlights

Approximate Duration: 4 1/2 hours

Level 1

Casablanca is Morocco's largest city and a world-renowned center for trade. Start with a visit to the central market, a massive kaleidoscope of colors and home to hundreds of stalls brimming with locally-grown flowers, spices, vegetables, meats and all kinds of seafood, as well as handicrafts; colorful characters can also be found here. Continue to the new medina of Casablanca and the Habous quarter with its attractive Arab-Islamic architecture. Admire the impressive facade of the Royal Palace and cross the quarter and its colorful Olive Market on foot. Drive through the residential quarter of Anfa, where your guide will point out the residence in which a memorable and historical meeting was held during the Second World War, in 1943. Soft drinks will be served at the charming seaside resort of Ain Diab and your drive continues to the famous Hassan II Great Mosque for a visit of this great architectural masterpiece. This is the world's largest religious monument after Mecca and its minaret is the tallest. Continue your coastal drive to Sidi Abderrahman, built on an island-like rock. Learn about the mystic fascination that this place retains, where people come to seek the saint's blessing, a cure for infertility or illness. You'll have some free time at Mohamed V's Square for more photo opportunities or even some shopping.

Charming Portuguese Towns of Morocco

Approximate Duration: 8 hours

Level 2, Meal

The charm of the towns of El Jadida and Azemmour comes from their medinas. Their narrow streets, beautiful buildings and gates combine a mixture of Portuguese, Arab, Andalusian and Berber architectural styles. Your tour begins with a drive from the pier to Azemmour via the charming coastal road. Stop at the entrance of Azemmour for a panoramic view of this white-washed town on the banks of the Oum Rabiaa River. Then, drive to one of the town's main gates Sidi Makhfi, named after one of the town's sophism figures. Walk through the Kasbah to reach a large square overlooking the river. Close to the square, a synagogue is still standing as a witness to the coexistence among the native inhabitants and the Jewish community. Board your coach and head to the other Portuguese town of Mazagane, later named El Jadida by the Arabs to enjoy a Moroccan-style lunch. In the afternoon, visit the cistern built by the Portuguese settlers to serve as a water reservoir in the event of a prolonged siege. Walk through the medina and stop for a panoramic view of the port and the Atlantic Ocean. On your return to Casablanca, stop at the Hassan II Mosque for photos. There will be an optional shopping stop at Casablanca before returning to your ship.

Note: This tour involves walking for approximately one mile on mostly uneven ground.

Agadir, Morocco

The Berber Oasis of Tiout

Approximate Duration: 8 hours

Level 2, Meal

This is the perfect tour for an adventurer who wants to experience life in the countryside. Depart the pier heading through the new Agadir, with luxurious hotels, cafes and restaurants. Taroudant, also known as the small Marrakech, is just 1-1/2 hours away. It's a town that is half citadel, half oasis; it possesses great charm and grace, with its majestic gold, pink and orange high walls. Drive around the historical wall surrounding the city and stop for photos. Enter the medina through one of its gates and cross its narrow and colorful streets and souks before continuing to the Berber Village and Oasis of Tiout, approximately 18 miles (30 km) away. You might catch a glimpse of goats eating on the top of argan trees by the roadside and if possible, your bus will stop for a unique photo opportunity. Upon arrival, you'll be welcomed by the local Berber inhabitants with their saddled mules and donkeys, ready to assist you with a ride to discover the oasis of the village with its palm grove, river and bridge (the ride is included, but gratuities are expected). Enjoy lunch in this country setting under Berber tents where you'll see local folk entertainers and experience the real life of the Berbers while enjoying Moroccan specialties. Then it's back to your bus by donkey and mule ride for your return to Agadir. Relax and enjoy the views during your two-hour drive.

Note: Tour participation is limited. Facilities are basic.

The Saadian Capital of Taroudant

Approximate Duration: 5 ½ hours

Level 1

Start your day with a visit to Agadir's Kasbah. Only the remains of this ancient fortress are there today as it was destroyed almost completely by an earthquake in 1960. Enjoy the panoramic view over the Atlantic Ocean and the new Agadir from this view point. Continue your drive through the new Agadir, with its luxurious hotels, cafes and restaurants en route to the beautiful city of Taroudant. An hour and a half away, Taroudant is a typical Moroccan city, known by many as the small Marrakech. On the way, stop for a unique opportunity to photograph the goats eating on top of argan trees, a unique occurrence in this area. Then drive around the historical wall surrounding the city, which also gives you a unique photo opportunity. Imagining life centuries ago in Taroudant requires virtually no effort, as the town gives the impression that not much has changed in a very long time. You'll enter the medina through one of its gates, and cross its narrow, lively streets and its souks, among the most colorful ones in Morocco with its stone polishers, jewelers and local spice sellers. Enjoy the moment; take in the atmosphere with its vibrant colors and exotic aromas. Cross Mellah, the former Jewish quarter, and before the return drive, enjoy refreshments at one of the city's ancient palaces, now transformed into a luxury hotel.

Modern Agadir & Berber Market

Approximate Duration: 3 ½ hours

Level 1

Agadir began as a fort constructed in 1505 by an enterprising Portuguese mariner. Its history is punctuated by peaks and valleys of prosperity, from the 18th century when only 12 houses remained, to the bustling metropolis that you'll visit. An earthquake that struck on February 29, 1960 flattened the city and although it has been rebuilt since, it's no longer a typical Moroccan city. Today's Agadir, with its modern architecture and almost year-round



sunshine, is a favorite of European vacationers. Drive northeast to the old Kasbah, a gaunt giant overlooking the city and a rich reminder of Agadir before the earthquake. A Dutch inscription from 1746 still adorns the gateway – Fear God and Honor Your King. Today the Kasbah is known for its breathtaking view over Agadir's endless beach. From the belvedere, descend on a short drive to the Berber market of Inezgane and walk through its colourful souks. Continue to the shopping area in the city center where you'll find everything from the namesake carpets to fine handicrafts. On the return drive, pause at a seaside resort for a refreshing soft drink before arriving at the pier.

Fantasia Horse Show & Camel Ride

Approximate Duration: 3 hours

Level 1, Guest with Disabilities

Drive from the pier directly to Inezgane's visitor complex, on the outskirts of Agadir in a rustic setting where you'll be welcomed by singers. Moroccan pastries and mint tea will be served under traditional Berber tents as you enjoy belly dancing, Berber dances and Andalusian music. Don't miss the opportunity to try a camel ride. Then, watch a horse race run by horsemen in traditional costumes, firing their rifles at the end of the race. This racing is a symbol of manhood, courage, and hospitality. Finally, stop at Agadir's Kasbah for a panoramic view and a great photo opportunity before returning to your ship.

Best of Agadir

Approximate Duration: 5 hours

Level 1

Today, Agadir is a city of modern architecture and almost year-round sunshine, making it a favorite of European vacationers. Your first visit today will be to the old Kasbah, a gaunt giant overlooking the city and a rich reminder of Agadir before the big earthquake. A Dutch inscription from 1746 still adorns the gateway – Fear God and Honor your King. Today the Kasbah is known for its breathtaking view over Agadir's endless beach. You'll take a short drive to the Berber Market of Inezgane. Here, among the maze of souks you'll find everything from the namesake carpeting to fine handicrafts. At the touristic complex, you'll be welcomed by traditional Moroccan hospitality by the popular Moroccan singers. A variety of Moroccan pastries and mint tea will be served under the traditional Berber tents, while enjoying the local performances by dancers and entertainers such as, belly dancing and Berber dances, among others. You'll also have an opportunity for an optional camel ride. Then, enjoy a traditional horse race, performed by horsemen in their traditional costumes with rifles that they shoot at the end of the race. The race is deep-rooted in the Moroccan collective unconscious as a symbol of manhood, courage and hospitality. You'll return to Agadir's city center for some free time to walk around and do some shopping before the return to your ship.

Las Palmas (Gran Canaria), Spain

Tour Code: LPA_50

Discover Gran Canaria & Painted Caves

Approximate Duration: 5 hours

Level 2

Discover the archaeological character of Los Guanches, the first inhabitants of the island and discover this beautiful land. Drive in the direction of Arucas, well-known for its 'black cathedral'. Then visit the Jardin de la Marquesa, which contains one of the most complete collections of tropical and sub-tropical flora. The garden's creator, Marques de Arucas, collected the flora until he was able to create an ideal habitat for the development of the over 2,500 species currently on display, thanks to the microclimate in the historical town of Arucas. Many species seen here are now extinct elsewhere. Continue to Cenobio de Valeron to find out the secrets hidden in it and the old Guanche caves, which you'll be able to view from the outside. Returning to your ship, drive to Galdar to visit the Cueva Pintada (Painted Cave) Museum and Archaeological Park. It is a required visit for those interested in the pre-Hispanic past of the island.

Note: This tour has very limited capacity due to restrictions in the number of visitors allowed in the caves.

Native Gran Canaria

Approximate Duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 2

The tour begins at the old town of Vegueta after a short journey along the main motorway of the east coast of the island. After reaching the oldest quarter in the city, you'll start a walking tour at the Perez Galdos Theater, reaching Santa Ana's Square, where you can admire the facades of the Town Hall, the bishop's house and the cathedral. Continue to the Canarian Museum, a cultural point of reference in the city. The permanent exhibition displayed is almost entirely devoted to the Aboriginal population of Gran Canaria. The exhibition is designed to explain the way these early inhabitants of the island lived over a period of time that goes from about 500 B.C. to the 15th century, when the Spaniards conquered and colonized the island. After the visit to the Canarian Museum, continue the walk towards Pilar Nuevo Square where you'll admire one of the most beautiful facades at Columbus's house, located in the historical district of Vegueta. This is where he lived before departing to discover America, which commemorates America's connection with the city. The conserved original elements make the house a landmark in the city. Leaving the Las Palmas capital, continue your journey along a winding road that crosses vineyards, where the famous Wine of Monte is made. Arrive at the amazing Crater of Bandama, a volcanic crater, 3,281 feet in diameter and 656 feet in depth, and close to it, the Pico de Bandama, which is 1,867 feet (569 meters) in altitude. Carrying on through the university town of Tafira, you'll visit the Jardin Canario, the largest botanical gardens in Spain, to admire a vast variety of plants.

Caldera los Marteles Trekking Adventure

Approximate Duration: 5 ½ hours

Level 3

Experience the natural setting of this striking area of the island. After a panoramic drive to the Caldera, your approximately 3 1/2-hour trek starts off from the top for approximately 4.3 miles (7 km). Enjoy the views from this vantage point as the pathway descends between areas of cultural value and a little group of houses. You'll reach a footpath that takes you towards the precipice of Guayadeque, amidst great colorful vegetation, typical houses and peaceful scenery.

Note: Proper trekking attire is recommended. Bring sun protection and bottled water.

Discovering the South

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 2

The South of Gran Canaria, with its dunes and the beaches of Playa del Ingles and San Agustin, is currently the most significant tourist area of Spain. Head south crossing picturesque villages and arrive in Aguimes, where you'll visit the historic part of this village and have some free time to stroll through its narrow streets. Departing from Aguimes and crossing Cruce de Arinaga, you'll visit the protected natural area of the Maspaldomas Dunes, an adjacent area approximately 4 1/2 miles (8 km) long with a small fresh-water lake and a palm grove. These dunes provide a habitat for a number of rare plant species which managed to survive in this arid environment,



some of which are only to be found in the Canaries. You'll continue to visit the new Meloneras area, with its Congress Center, nice hotels, shopping and oceanfront boulevards. Depart this tourist resort for a short drive to the Mirador de la Degollada. From this magnificent lookout point you'll be able to view Playa del Ingles, before the return drive to your ship.

Canarian Panorama

Approximate Duration: 5 hours

Level 1

Discover the cultural heritage and natural beauty of Gran Canaria. Departing the pier, drive to the village of Santa Brigida where you'll visit a typical farm, representative of the agriculture and nature of the island. Stop for a snack at Las Grutas de Artilles, a landmark restaurant dug into the hillside, and greatly admired by tourists because of its impressive location and architecture, which is surrounded by beautiful gardens and caverns connected by passages. Continue to the village of Teror, where colonial buildings grace the town's wide boulevards. The village also features Gran Canaria's prettiest church, which you'll see from the outside. Then it's on to Arucas, one of the island's most important agricultural centers. This town is affectionately known as the 'banana capital' and you'll have the opportunity to visit the local plantation, Jardin de la Marquesa before you head back to your ship.

Las Palmas & Bandama

Approximate duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 2

Las Palmas is the largest town in the Canary Islands, the capital city of Gran Canaria and is also a great place to shop. Enjoy the ride from the Puerto de la Luz to enchanting Parque Doramas, landscaped with typical Canarian flora and dragon trees. Visit the Pueblo Canario, a model of a traditional Canarian Village, situated inside the park and designed by the famous artist Nestor de la Torre. Continue to the oldest quarter of Las Palmas, called Vegueta which is a maze of narrow, cobblestone streets and tiny shaded squares. You'll see the colorful market and pass by the Plaza Santa Ana with its bronze statues in honor of the dogs which gave the Canary Islands their name (canum in Latin); the song-birds were later named after the islands. Facing the plaza is the Cathedral Santa Ana with its impressive 19th century neoclassical Roman columns. Continue through the exclusive residential area of Tafira, as you ride up to the vast volcanic crater of Bandama, an extinct volcano rising nearly 1,867 feet (569 meters) above sea level. Have your camera ready, as you enjoy panoramic views of the island and the first golf course built in Spain. Then proceed to the villages of La Atalaya, where pottery is still being made without a wheel. Next, visit the lush Botanic Gardens in La Calzada and enjoy an impressive collection of regional plants in their native habitats. Finally, enjoy a photo stop at Altavista with its magnificent views of Las Palmas, Las Canteras Beach and the harbor.

Eira Do Serrado & Monte

Your coach will take you inland, passing through Sao Martinho to the Socorridos ravine. Eira do Serrado is reached after a short drive along a winding road, offering spectacular views of the interior of the island. Here, it is a short and easy walk up to the viewpoint on Pico de Serrado at an altitude of approximately 3,592 feet (1,094 meters), for an amazing view down onto the village of Curral das Freiras. Curral das Freiras (Nuns Valley) is a small village nestling between almost perpendicular mountains in the heart of the island. In 1566, the nuns from the Santa Clara convent fled from pirates attacking Funchal and found seclusion here where they also brought the convent's treasure. Your next stop will be at Monte. This small village, perched up in the hills overlooking Funchal, was formerly a health resort for Europe's high society, including Austrian Emperor Charles I. One of its long-lost features was a rack railway, which connected Monte with Funchal. From here you'll board the cable car and see Madeira from the air, experiencing the wonderful views all the way down to Funchal. The cable car is made up of 40 small cabins with a capacity of up to eight people per cabin and has an approximate duration of 15 minutes. Your last stop will be at an important wine lodge, where a sample of the famous Madeira wine will be offered.

Note: A jacket is recommended as Madeira has a microclimate. This tour involves approximately 3/4-mile of walking (5 to 10 minutes) on cobblestones and uneven surfaces with approximately five steps to get to the viewpoint at Eira Do Serrado; approximately 10 steps at Monte and five to eight steps at the Madeira Wine Company. Madeira's Breathtaking Beauty

Climbing up towards the central mountain range, your tour takes the road that leads to Monte, a village notable for its many fine properties and gardens. The ride down the hill on the wicker sled is an exciting one, giving you a taste of the Madeira of past decades, when this was the established form of transport. Then, proceed to Pico do Arieiro, the third highest peak on the island with an altitude of almost 6,000 feet (1,818 meters). Views are spectacular up here and on a clear day, it is even possible to see Porto Santo, the neighboring island, which is situated 30 nautical miles to the north. Continue to Camacha, a beautiful small village on the hills east of Funchal. It is famous for its 'Apple Festival' and its very active folklore dance groups. Camacha is also called 'the village of basket makers' which is actually not doing it any justice as it is much more than that; it represents the center of Madeira's willow craft industry. Nowadays they make furniture, hats, ornaments, kitchen utensils, wine holders and of course, baskets of all sizes and shapes. All in all, over 1,000 different articles are on exhibition, which is an absolute 'must see' for every visitor.

Funchal & Botanical Gardens

The tour continues to the village of Monte, where you have time to explore this small village perched up in the hills overlooking Funchal, and formerly a health resort for Europe's high society. After this visit, you'll have the opportunity to experience a voyage by cable car with nature at your feet! Made up by 12 cabins of eight seats each, this unforgettable voyage to the Botanical Gardens will take about seven minutes and offers its visitors a new panoramic route with privileged sights of not only Funchal's bay but also over the River of Joao Gomes, a place of rare and exotic beauty made up by an important nucleus of Laurissilva forest. Since the 17th century, Madeira Island had been waiting for a botanical garden, a dream that came true in 1960. Located less than two miles from the center of Funchal at Quinta do Bom Sucesso – a private Quinta belonging to the Reid's family – where the climatic conditions are much in favor of exuberant vegetation, the Botanical Garden boasts harmonious forms, contrasting colors and more than 2,000 plants. Throughout the gardens you can find the plants labeled with their scientific names, common name and origin.

town boasts many street cafes and shops and is certainly a place to spend some time taking in the sights and sounds. Ribeira Brava was one of the first parishes of the island and was inhabited early in the island's history.

Coming from Funchal, when you arrive at this recently designated city, you'll find a dazzling bay, the full beauty of which can only best admired from Pico da Torre. Once in Camara de Lobos you'll visit the shop of Henriques & Henriques, which is now the largest independent producer and shipper of Madeira Wines and the only Madeira House who owns vineyards. The new installations provide the company with modern vinification and an ageing capacity. The company relies on the most recent technical innovations, keeping however the unbroken family tradition that has lasted for 500 years in the production of the finest Madeira wines. After this visit you'll then be driven back to your ship.

Granada & the Magnificent Alhambra

Approximate Duration: 9 ½ hours

In the shadow of the mighty Sierra Nevada lays Granada, a peculiar blend of Arab and European culture with a wealth of extraordinary monuments. Take in the views, as you travel north over the Malaga mountains and through the picturesque countryside. Visit the Alhambra, palace of the sultans and one of the finest examples of Moorish art in Spain. Six centuries of Moorish rule left an indelible mark on Spanish culture and architecture, especially in the south in Andalusia, where this palatial complex is one of the world's great architectural wonders. The Alhambra has been damaged and restored over the centuries, but it's not difficult to picture the place as it was, in all its glory 600 years ago. From floor to ceiling, every inch seems to be covered with some kind of pattern: geometric, floral or Arabic script. The ceilings drip with stucco stalactites and each room seems more richly decorated than the previous one, with wood filigree, courtyards and fountains. Rose-colored walls stand in sharp contrast to the turquoise and black Pool of Myrtles and the garden is scented with jasmine and rose. Continue to the small summer palace along an avenue of stately cypress trees and venture into the Generalife Gardens, with trimmed flowerbeds and box hedges, myrtle bushes and above all, fountains. The view from the gardens is splendid. After lunch at a local restaurant, enjoy a panoramic tour of the city making a photo stop at the Albaycin district.

Picturesque Ronda

A local guide will accompany you on an approximately two-hour walking tour of the Moorish city, with its narrow, cobblestone streets, white houses, imposing porticos and grilled windows. After your walking tour, enjoy lunch and return to the port by the same spectacular route.

Amazing Caves of Nerja

The coastline east of Malaga is not as well-known to tourists as the other side, but towns such as La Cala, Rincon de la Victoria and Torre del Mar, are popular for Spaniards. Along this subtropical coast grows sugar cane, avocado and custard trees. Some 35 miles from Malaga is Nerja, which counts many retired Britons among its residents. The historic center, which begins in the Balcony of Europe, dates from around 1487. Its 9th century castle is today a perfect viewpoint above the sea. To the side of the balcony, you'll find the 17th century Savior Church, constructed in Baroque-Mudejar style and the 16th century Our Lady of Sorrows Hermitage with its paintings by the master Alonso Cano. In the old quarter of town, typical small shops offer local handicrafts and local products such as sweet wine, olive oil, honey and tropical fruits. After a walk through the city, you'll continue to the famous Caves of Nerja. Millions of years old, these breathtaking beautiful caves, should not be missed. Your surroundings get more fascinating as you descend deeper into the bowels of the earth. In its interior you'll gaze in awe the largest stalagmites columns in the world, 161 feet high and 59 feet in diameter. Their capricious rocky formations can be compared to Modernist cathedrals, and their eight rooms include the Room of the Cataclysm, as well as the Room of the Cascade. Every year in August the Festivals of Music and Dance take place here.

Before returning to your ship, pass through Fuengirola and Torremolinos, two very popular holiday destinations with miles of sandy beaches.

Wander along the promenade and people-watch or follow your guide on a walk of this vibrant town.

As you walk along the ramparts crowning the 560-foot-high summit, admire splendid views over the city, the harbor and the bullring. The restored Alcazaba dates back to the 11th century when the king of Granada ordered the fortress built and modeled on the style of the Alhambra. After the Christian conquest, the Catholic kings took over the Alcazaba and King Philip IV used it as his residence when visiting Malaga. Leaving the Alcazaba, your walk continues to the cathedral. You'll admire its fabulous interior, the exquisitely carved choir stalls and other fine examples of Spanish Renaissance sculpture.

City Highlights with Transfer

Approximate Duration: 3 ½ hours

Level 1, Debarck

At first sight you'll see that Barcelona is a city with charming streets, busy with people and full of life. The old town districts are famed for their historical monuments, narrow streets and Bohemian atmosphere, and are a perfect place for a stroll. The city also has the biggest selection of modernist architecture making it a genuine open-air museum. Barcelona is the only European capital with almost three miles of beaches where you can enjoy the most modern amenities. From the pier, head to the Sagrada Familia, passing through the Barceloneta Quarter or Fisherman Area, and Calle Marina. From here, you'll continue the panoramic drive along Passeig de Gracia, the best-known boulevard in town. See one of the masterpieces of Gaudi's architecture: the Casa Mila, best known by Barcelonians as 'La Pedrera' and Casa Batllo. Reaching Diagonal Avenue you enter the upper Eixample Area where the Sagrada Familia Temple is. From the outside, guides will offer you an explanation of all the details related to the temple. Continue to the Montjuich Hill, claimed by the city on the occasion of the 1929 International Exposition, when the mountain was developed and trade fair halls and sports installations were constructed as well as the parks and gardens which are to be found all over the mountain. Today it is the most important recreational area in Barcelona. Drive by the Olympic Ring and make a brief stop at the Mirador del Alcalde for a panoramic view of the city. Finally, arrive at the Gothic Quarter for a walking visit. The facade of the cathedral and octagonal dome are Neo-Gothic structures of the 19th century, designed according to a 15th-century drawing. From here, you'll be dropped off at an NCL program hotel, Catalunya Square or continue to the airport.

Montserrat with Transfer

Approximate Duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 2, Debark

Barcelona's favorable location, in perfect harmony with its immediate surroundings, together with its ease of access and varied climate, make it a starting point for discovering new landscapes and enjoying contact with nature. Your tour departs from the port passing through the main streets of Barcelona, to reach Catalunya Square, considered the heart of the city. From here, you'll continue the panoramic drive along Passeig de Gracia, the best-known boulevard in town. Your guide will point out one of the masterpieces of Gaudi's architecture: the Casa Mila and Casa Batllo; two of the best-known landmarks of the city. Reaching Diagonal Avenue your tour continues to Montserrat, a peculiar rocky mountain range which is the site of the monastery where people come to worship 'La Moreneta,' the Black Madonna who is the patron-virgin of Catalonia. The Benedictine Monastery of Montserrat was founded in the 11th century and is located in a natural park 37 miles to the west of Barcelona. The Benedictine community, now numbering some 80 monks, has served the shrine for almost a thousand years. They are dedicated to a life of prayer, to working, and to welcoming pilgrims, making the site a place for dialogue, prayer and culture. Besides the monks, the Escolans also live in Montserrat who form the oldest boy's choir in Europe. During your stay and visit to Montserrat, you'll have a chance for an optional ride on the Funicular of San Juan which goes up to the panoramic point from where you'll admire beautiful views. Once you finish the visit you'll be driven to an NCL program hotel, Catalunya Square or the airport.
