Exploring Magnificent Cartagena

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 2

Your exploration of the magnificent city of Cartagena de Indias starts with a visit to La Popa Monastery, previously known as the 'stern of a galleon'. This ancient monastery located a top of a hill can be seen from any point in Cartagena and offers a privileged view of the city. Built at the beginning of the 17th century and still inhabited by monks, it was used several times as a fortress because of its strategic location. It houses a chapel dedicated to Virgen de la Candelaria, patron saint of Cartagena and a Colonial museum. Continue to San Felipe de Barajas situated outside the walled city, for a panoramic view of this monumental fort considered to be the most outstanding feat of Spanish military engineering in the New World. Its construction began in 1536 and lasted for 121 years. Your tour continues to the walled city, where construction took 194 years to be completed and which enabled Cartagena to defend itself from English attacks. The ramparts, the narrow streets, Colonial balconies and the main squares are marvelous tourist attractions today. A visit to San Pedro Claver cloister and monastery, built in homage to the protector of slaves, constitutes another point of interest within the walled city.

Note: Guests must walk approximately 5 blocks in the Colonial part of the city.

Folkloric Show & Old Cartagena

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Start your tour of the magnificent city of Cartagena de Indias with a panoramic view of San Felipe de Barajas Fortress, situated outside the walled city. This monumental fort is considered to be the most outstanding feat of Spanish military engineering in the New World. Its construction began in the year 1536 and lasted for 121 years. Entering the walled city, you'll stop for approximately 15 minutes for photos at San Francisco Battery giving you the opportunity to view the well- preserved 16th century houses, churches, plazas and museums. You'll walk about five blocks through narrow streets and passing beautiful balconies to reach Plaza de Bolivar, where the Inquisition Palace, cathedral and Gold Museum are located. Enjoy a folkloric show during your visit to the Heredia Theater. This monument was built of the ruins of an old Mercy Church (1625) to commemorate the centenary of the independence (1911) and restored as a cultural center for theater and musical performances. One beer, water or soft drink will be served upon arrival at the theater. Before the return to your ship, your last stop will be at Bocagrande – the most modern area of Cartagena – with its shopping center of Pierino Gallo.

Colonial Cartagena

Approximate Duration: 3 ½ hours

Level 2

Begin your tour with a panoramic view of the military fort of San Felipe de Barajas. Situated outside the walled city, this monumental fort is considered to be the most outstanding feat of Spanish military engineering in the New World. Continue to the El Cabrero neighborhood for a visit to the Rafael Nunez House and Museum. Rafael Nunez is one of the most illustrious cartagenos of all times. He became president of Colombia four times and created the constitution of 1886. The house where he lived and died is built in the spectacular Antilles architectural style and is now a museum. During your guided walk you'll admire some of the best-preserved Colonial Spanish architecture in South America with its imposing merchant's houses, narrow streets, flower-bedecked balconies stunning civic buildings and beautiful churches. Next visit the Dungeons within the walled city ramparts, which were built to store provisions for the troops and are now home to a high quality handicrafts market selling brightly decorated cloth, woodwork and woven bags made by some of the indigenous peoples of Colombia. Your tour continues to the Palace of Inquisition. The aim of the Inquisition was to judge crimes against the Catholic faith, but it never recognized anyone's innocence. This building whose construction was finished in 1776 is an example of civilian architecture of the 18th century. Walk to the Plaza Bolivar where you'll visit the Gold Museum which houses a complete and beautiful archeological display of the pre-Colombian cultures and the fabled El Dorado. You'll have some spare time for shopping in the old city for the famous Colombian emeralds or an opportunity to take more pictures of this lovely city.



Note: The Gold Museum is closed on Mondays when it will be substituted by a visit to Galeria Cano next door, which has replicas of the Gold Museum.

Mud Volcano & City Sights

Approximate Duration: 4 hours

Level 3

Board your air-conditioned transportation for the approximately 45-minute drive to the infamous mud volcano. On the way to the volcano, pass by the imposing San Felipe de Barajas Fortress situated outside the walled city. Upon arrival at the mud volcano an orientation to the rustic facilities will be provided. A mud volcano is created by natural gases emitted by decaying organic matter underground. As the mud is pushed upwards by the gas, it deposits and hardens above ground and forms what appears to be a huge anthill. As more mud oozes out and spills over the edge it grows in size, gradually forming what you can see today: a miniature 50-foot volcano with a rich, creamy, mud crater at the top. If you have never been in a mud volcano before, then the initial feeling of mud on your skin is unusual to say the least. When you feel like you are about to become one with the earth, just climb back down the staircase and stroll down to the nearby freshwater lake where you can wash the mud off.

Note: The temperature of the mud is very warm to hot, therefore those who are susceptible to heat must not participate on this tour. It's said that the mud has healing properties; however the truth to this statement is not proven. To reach the top of the mud volcano where the pool of mud is located, requires the negotiation of numerous, steep steps. Wear a swimsuit and bring a towel and adequate sun protection.

Mangrove Eco Canoe Journey

Approximate Duration: 3 hours

Level 2

Start with a panoramic drive to view the San Felipe de Barajas Fortress, situated outside the walled city. This monumental fort is considered to be the most outstanding feat of Spanish military engineering in the New World. After a quick drive through the narrow streets of the walled city, you'll continue along the coastline to the Cueva del Manglar. Embark on a leisurely canoe ride through the mangrove tunnels and across the Swamp of the Virgin. Relax as you enjoy the beautiful flora and fauna that encompasses this fascinating eco-system.

Note: Wear comfortable clothing and shoes and bring sunscreen and a hat.

Cartagena Sightseeing

Approximate Duration: 2 ½ hours

Level 1

See the best of Cartagena with a tour of the city accompanied by local guide experts. Your first stop will be a view of the imposing military fort of San Felipe de Barajas situated outside the walled city and considered to be the most outstanding feat of Spanish military engineering in the New World. You'll then continue to the historic Colonial city characterized by its walls which took 194 years to complete. These immense walls enabled Cartagena to defend itself from the numerous attacks of English pirates and other invaders. You'll be able to walk through Spanish Colonial architecture, some of the best preserved in South America with its imposing merchant's houses, narrow streets, flower-bedecked balconies, civic buildings and beautiful churches. The city is dotted with many squares and public spaces which are now home to sidewalk cafes and restaurants where locals and visitors relax and enjoy the magic of this city. Your next stop will be Bocagrande, which in contrast with the old city is modern with high rise apartment complexes, hotels and restaurants and a great place for visitors. You'll then have a brief stop for shopping at the Pierino Gallo Shopping Center famous for its wide variety of jewelry shops.

Note: There is a 30 minute continuous walk in the old town. Bring comfortable attire, hat and sun block.

City Views with Carriage Ride

Approximate Duration: 2 ½ hours

Level 1

Begin your tour with a view of the impressive military fort of San Felipe de Barajas, the greatest and strongest fortress ever built by the Spaniards in their colonies. This is an exceptional accomplishment of Spanish military engineering where construction began in 1656 and lasted for 121 years. You'll visit the dungeons within the walled city ramparts which were built to store provisions for the troops and are now home to a high quality handicrafts market. This market offers a variety of brightly decorated cloths, woodwork and woven bags made by some of the indigenous people of Colombia. Once at the dungeons, a 30-minute horse carriage ride will take you



through the narrow streets of the walled city where you'll find Colonial houses and squares such as La Merced, Santo Domingo, Custom Square, San Pedro Claver, and the beautiful Baroque door of the Inquisition Palace at Bolivar Square. After the horse carriage ride you'll be given free time in the old city to do some walking, shopping or take pictures of the lovely streets.

Note: Bring comfortable attire, hat and sun block.

Sailing a Spanish Galleon

Approximate Duration: 2 hours

Level 1

Board a replica of a 17th-century old galleon which will take you on a two-hour cruise around Cartagena's bay. A guide will provide you with information on the general history of Cartagena and the sights. While cruising, take in a lovely view of Fort of Manzanillo located at the eastern entrance of the bay. Enjoy the sun and the cool tropical breezes as you forge ahead between the faraway island of Tierra Bomba and the Castillo Grande Peninsula. Marvel at the age-old walled city of Cartagena and enjoy a refreshing drink as you get lost in the panoramic views of land and sea. Following, you'll have a chance to enjoy a traditional folkloric show celebrating the history and culture of Cartagena.

Note: There is a total walking distance of 150 yards. Bring comfortable shoes, clothes, sunscreen and a camera.

Best of Rosario Islands

Approximate Duration: 6 hours

Level 1, Meal

Indulge yourself on scenic speedboat ride along the coast of Colombia to the Rosario Islands located 24 miles to the south of Cartagena. The Rosario Islands are made up of 27 islands brimming with crystal-clear water, sandy beaches and swaying palm trees. The area is designated as a National Natural Park which is ideal for the development of coral reefs in its 34 miles of protected area with depths up to 90 feet. Start off at Isla del Sol for some refreshments and fresh fruit, then take off on a 15-minute sightseeing cruise around the islands and marvel at the spectacular views of the archipelago. Visit the aquarium at Isla de San Martin which is home to a vast array of marine life including tropical fish, turtles, sharks, and enjoy a spectacular dolphin show. Once back at Isla del Sol, you'll have a chance to snorkel, and admire coral reefs, sponges and many different kinds of fish. You may also choose to relax and enjoy the swimming pool and beach area, along with a complimentary lunch.

Note: Bring your swimsuit and a towel. Snorkel tours and gear are available at an additional cost. There is a total walking distance of 200 yards.

Costa Rica in Essence
Approximate Duration: 8 ½ hours

Level 1, Guests with Disabilities, Meal

This full day experience will allow you to experience Costa Rica's culture, society and nature of the country. Your guide will lead you through the country's beautiful landscape along the way. Once in San Jose, your first stop will be at the National Museum of Pre-Colombian Art, for an entertaining and well-documented narrative on the country's heritage where you'll have a chance to appreciate the Pre-Colombian jade and gold exhibits. Your next stop will be the Opera House, a close replica of the Paris Opera House, and a bastion of culture. This venue represents the love the Costa Ricans have for the fine arts. You'll then enjoy a complimentary lunch at one of the country's leading restaurants before visiting the artisan town of Sarchi known for its beautiful and intricate handicrafts and souvenirs. This picturesque town is perhaps most widely recognized for its colorful and decorative oxcarts that have been made here for over a century.

Picturesque Sarchi
Approximate Duration: 5 ½ hours

Level 1

At the heart of the central valley high in the mountains, is the small town of Sarchi, cradle to famous wood carvers and artisans that gave identity to the country's local craft and lore. You'll start your tour by observing quaint villages, fields of sugar cane, cattle ranches and coffee plantations, and traveling through the Central Volcanic Mountain Range where the deep green of its hills lies in dramatic contrast to the colors of the coastal region. A professional guide will get you acquainted with the country's history, politics and culture. You'll recognize the town of Sarchi by its bright colors and friendly people, proudly displaying the brightly colored hand painted ox cart – the country's typical symbol. Some shopping time will be given at the artisan's village. Your last stop will be the interesting town of Grecia, known for its unique metal church called the Cathedral de la Mercedes. This deep dark red-colored church has a Gothic style and it is made from metal pieces that were imported from Belgium in the 1890s.

A Cloud Forest & Poas National Park
Approximate Duration: 8 ½ hours

Level 2, Meal, Age Requirements

From the low coastal areas, head into the clouds and discover the incredibly diverse landscape, the ever-



changing vegetation and spectacular scenery that this journey provides. One of the most renowned parks in Costa Rica, the Poas National Park is one of the few cloud forests accessible from the Pacific coast. On a clear day, it is possible to peer into the volcano's crater which is surrounded by lush cloud forest, and see geysers of steam and smoke rising from the bubbling depths. After a visit to the park, continue your journey through spectacular scenery, which brings to mind the fields and pastures of the Swiss Alps. This is the region that gave Costa Rica its nickname, 'the Switzerland of Central America'. Soon you will reach a traditional mountain retreat, where a typical 'Tico' meal will be served. After lunch, head to Sarchi, home to a large artisan community, where the most beautiful handicrafts are produced by local artists. While you journey back to your ship you'll pass sugarcane and coffee plantations that were once the main trade of Costa Rica.

Note: Participants must be in good physical condition. Comfortable clothing, walking shoes, a windbreaker and/or rain gear are recommended. At times, clouds may obstruct the view of the crater. Not recommended for those with heart problems, as you'll be ascending to a height of 2,700 feet above sea level. Due to the duration of the tour, this excursion will not be available on Norwegian Star 11/23/09 & 1/02/2010.

Carara Tropical Rainforest

Approximate Duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 2

The Carara National Park offers the casual explorer a tremendous insight to the complex world of the tropical rainforest and it is ideal for those who wish to become acquainted with the exotic flora and fauna that thrive in the tropics. Over 10,000 species of plants, 300 species of birds and some 200 species of butterflies are present in this transitional zone. Scarlet macaws, howler monkeys, white collared monkeys, coatimundis, peccaries, crocodiles and toucans are a few of the animals that call this area their home. The key to your learning adventure is an experienced naturalist guide, a true master of the forest, who is able to interpret all the messages and signs the jungle puts forth and translates them for you to understand. He will expose the delicate balance between plants, insects and animals and will show you the treasures mother earth gives us.

Note: Travel time is approximately one hour each way. Walking time in the forest will be approximately two hours, under mostly shady areas. Paths used in the forest are over broken terrain and may be muddy. We recommend binoculars, light cotton clothes, long pants, a long sleeved shirt and comfortable walking shoes. Carara is a true biological reserve where animals are free to roam. The large extension of the park allows for animals to chose their habitat and spotting of these animals may not be guaranteed. Participants must be able to walk without assistance.

Outrigger Canoe

Approximate Duration: 5 hours

Level 2, Age Requirements

Take a scenic drive to a quiet beach where the Costa Rica Outrigger Team is making final preparations to set off on this half day program of adventure. Once at the beach you'll be assigned to a special canoe along with another eight partners and your 'eccentric' guide. The beauty of the outrigger canoe is that you share the work of paddling with your group of eight, thus if you feel like sitting back for a while and just looking at the spectacular scenery, you may do so and still continue on your way. Many compare the experience with 'rafting on the ocean'. Besides, as the canoe is fitted with floatation devices on either side, it is virtually unflappable! You'll glide easily past spectacular cliffs with abundant bird life and land on secluded beaches that offer the best snorkeling to be found on the Central Pacific Coast. Once landed, your guide will accompany those who wish to snorkel, making you feel at ease as they point out colorful fish and show you some of the underwater world.

Note: Participants must be at least 12 years of age. Complimentary snack will be served. Footwear such as sports sandals or tennis shoes are recommended. Guests should bring swim gear, shorts, sunscreen, towel, a hat and a change of clothes.

Pacific Train, Boat & Bus Adventure

Approximate Duration: 4 ¾ hours

Level 1, Guests with Disabilities

This combination excursion gives you the opportunity to ride a historical train that has been in service for more than 100 years and participate on a scenic ride through rural countryside and tropical fields. Afterwards, board your motorcoach en route to the Tarcoles River where you'll go on a boat and explore the spectacular natural scenery this river has to offer. The river and mangroves attract many types of bird wildlife such as toucans,



spoonbills, herons, egrets, jacanas, pelicans, scarlet macaws, iguanas and crocodiles. Upon your return enjoy some live marimba melodies and enjoy a delicious buffet of seasonal fruits and tropical refreshments. Enough time will be provided to select crafts made by local artisans before returning to your ship.

Note: This excursion might operate in reverse order. Please wear casual clothing, comfortable walking shoes, a hat, sunscreen, and bring a camera and raingear. Wildlife sightings while common cannot be guaranteed. Wheelchair restricted participants need to make advance reservations as space is very limited. Ice-cold bottled water will be provided during the train ride. The type of walking required is along even roads and compact gravel trails. This tour will not be available for sailing of N. Jungle Crocodile Safari

Approximate Duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 1, Guests with Disabilities, Weight Requirements

This adventure tour takes place in the Guacalillo Estuary on the Tarcoles River that forms the northern border of the Carara Biological Reserve. It's home to one of the world's largest crocodile populations in the world with individuals up to 20 feet long that can live up to 60 years. In addition to the crocodiles, over 50 different bird species might be seen on site. The Guacalillo Estuary, famous for its mangrove forests, is one of the nesting sites of the very rare scarlet macaw and a great variety of resident and migrant waterfowls. Your adventure begins with a one hour ride on coastal and countryside roads, passing small towns en route to the Guacalillo Estuary. Once you arrive, a motorized boat will take you through and up the river where you'll be able to observe these wild animals from a safe distance. A delicious tropical fruit buffet will be waiting for you at your return with tropical fruit drinks and coffee. Ample time for purchasing crafts made by local artisans will be given.

Note: Participants must weigh no more than 275 lbs. At the beginning of the exploration, you'll receive a free bird guide for you to be able to identify the birds that you might see. Wear comfortable shoes, long pants, a hat, sunscreen and bring sunglasses, a light jacket/raingear and insect repellent. Walking is over cemented and gravel trails. Advance notice is needed for guests in wheelchairs; nevertheless motorized scooters cannot be handled, only regular wheelchairs.

Original Canopy Puntarenas

Approximate Duration: 4 ½ hours

Level 3, Age & Weight Requirements

Board your guided air-conditioned transportation and pass through Puntarenas and its surrounding mangroves. Then, head inland into the coastal range of mountains passing by small towns and farming communities such as Barranca, Esparza and Jesus Maria. Here, you'll have the opportunity to see typical Costa Rican rural life. Along the way you may encounter different species of birds as well as sugar cane, bananas, coffee, mangos and other crops that are often exported to North America and Europe. Upon arrival to the canopy tour reception, you'll get geared up with the necessary equipment and briefed on safety instructions. You'll be guided on a 15 to 20 minute walk through the tropical transition forest to the beginning of the tour. Once here, you'll proceed to the first horizontal traverse cable. The Original Canopy Tour consists of nine observation platforms, and eight horizontal traverse cables connected between the immense trees of this tropical paradise. You'll follow a small stream suspended high in the air where wildlife sightings are very common. You may see white-faced capuchin, howler monkeys, varieties of birds, orchids, bromeliads and endangered majestic Mahogany trees. Your journey through the trees will take approximately an hour. At the end of the tour receive complimentary refreshment and fresh fruits. Also, other beverages and souvenirs will be available for purchase once back at the reception area. You'll travel back to the pier via a different scenic route, one that the early farmers used for taking their crops to the old port

Note: Participants must be at least 5 years of age and weigh no more than 275 lbs. Although wildlife sightseeing are common, they are not guaranteed. This tour is not recommended for pregnant women, or for guests with seizure disorders, heart, back, neck or balance problems. Wear closed toe shoes, bring insect repellent and a change of clothing is recommended.

You'll continue to Orotina for a stop at a fruits market, giving you a great opportunity to interact with the locals. Here you can find many types of truly exotic tropical fruits, such as caimitos (star apples), cashew fruits, mangos, zapotes and more. Your scenic drive includes some stretches along the Pacific Ocean passing by cantaloupe and watermelon plantations, farming areas and most certainly seeing some birds along the way, all examples of sustainable living. Take the opportunity to capture unique pictures for back home, while traveling down to sea level, admiring the most breathtaking views.

Note: Wear comfortable shoes; bring sunscreen, a hat and light clothing.

Pura Vida Gardens

Approximate Duration: 5 ¼ hours

Level 2

Visit one of the largest gardens in Costa Rica, Pura Vida Gardens which offers magnificent views of the Pacific coastline and surrounding mountains. This botanical garden has one mile of walkways with trails. Bordering this garden is Bijagual, one of the tallest waterfalls in Costa Rica. You'll find an enormous amount of flowering plants, including 60 varieties of heliconias, 10 varieties of ginger, blooming banana plants and of course, orchids. Butterflies are plentiful in this natural setting. There are also many species of birds such as macaws, parrots, parakeets, toucans, trogons, kingfishers, birds of prey of many species, and waterfowls. Iguanas and colorful frogs are also quite common.

Note: Wheelchairs cannot be accommodated due to the bus size which have no lift; however if guests can get on/off the bus, a folding chair on the rack can be placed. To make your trip more exciting the TERRA-X6 will pass some streams and areas of difficulty not possible for a normal vehicle. After a rest stop, continue heading north in search for more adventure in the mountains, which will eventually take you to the riverbank of the Barranca River, where snacks and drinks will be served.

Note: Participants must be at least 8 years of age and weigh no more than 250 lbs. Comfortable shoes, binoculars and/or cameras are recommended. On occasions the snacks and drinks may be carried out on the beach instead of by the river.

Coffee cultivation has been the primary source of income for many Costa Rican families since the turn of the 19th century. You'll visit a 670-acre cooperative farm owned by more than 2,300 farmers of whom 60% are women. Each member contributes almost 10 acres of land to the coop. The coffee that they cultivate and produce is sold directly to one of the largest coffee companies in the world, Starbucks. This coffee is also purchased by Rainforest Alliance, an organization that focuses on the conservation of biodiversity and sustainable development. You'll experience first-hand the coffee roasting process and have the chance to sample the flavorful brewing. Also see how the coffee beans, also known as cherries, are picked, sorted, peeled, fermented and sun-dried. Learn many interesting facts that will change your appreciation for this highly consumed beverage. Feel free to browse the selection of hand-made souvenirs before returning to your ship. The last stop will be at Sarchi to enjoy a delicious typical Costa Rican lunch.

Note: Minimum amount of walking over even surface and some steps. For wheelchair restricted customers, advance notice is required, since not all the buses in Costa Rica are equipped with ramps. Wear comfortable shoes, sunscreen, a hat and bring a camera and a light jacket.

Hot Springs Relaxing Experience

Approximate Duration: 7 hours

Level 1, Guests with Disabilities, Meal

If you're looking for the perfect balance between adventure and relaxation this excursion is just for you! Board a motorcoach for an exciting scenic ride through Costa Rica's countryside to the site of natural hot springs. Along the way encounter the country's varied landscape and admire the steep mountains in the distance and vast tropical plantations in the lowlands. The hot springs are located in the county of Abangares, a peculiar town that over a century ago was one of the most important gold digging and exploration centers, and where today you'll have the opportunity to see part of the history once written here. Upon arrival you'll be welcomed and then introduced to the natural spring, which reaches temperatures of 98 to 113 degrees Fahrenheit (37 to 45 degrees Celsius). Take advantage and visit the hot springs on site and prepare to relax. Appreciate the beautiful mountains and lush green flora you are surrounded by while consumed by the natural hot water baths. We also recommend stopping by the cool natural spring water pool to take a swim and refresh yourself. Then, enjoy a delicious typical Costa Rican lunch. Here you'll also have the opportunity to observe the collection of original pieces used during the mining period. Take home a memorable souvenir from the gift shop. Browse local arts, crafts and peddles made from locally-mined gold.

Note: This tour includes a minimum amount of walking over even surfaces and some steps. Only one swimming pool is wheelchair accessible; however, the tour is an excellent option for clients with limited mobility. Bring your swimsuit, a towel, hat and sunscreen.

Level 2, Meal, Age & Weight Requirements

The more commonly seen birds are ospreys, kingfishers, tiger and boat-billed herons. Other wildlife in the area includes otters, howler monkeys, white-faced monkeys, anteaters, iguanas and many other lizards. At the conclusion of your trip, a native-style lunch will be served.

The return to your ship will be at a specified time.

Pacaya Volcano Hike

Approximate Duration: 5 ½ hours

Level 3, Age & Weight Requirements

Head north towards Guatemala City. The entrance to the protected area that surrounds the volcano is located before arriving to the city, just before the town of Amatitlan. Once at the local town, your guided hike will begin. The hike is conducted by local expert guides and members of the local community, who are certified as volcano guides and nature defenders. Your volcano climb will be approximately two hours long until you reach the upper



platform. From there, the most fit and daring can continue to the peak, just above, where sulfur fumes, colored rocks and the crater make for a unique spectacle. The downhill hike is, of course, much faster, taking approximately one hour to return.

Note: Participants must be at least 5 years of age and weigh no more than 250 lbs. This hike consists of 2 hours of climbing and one of descending on steep ground, so participants must be in excellent physical condition. The Pacaya is an active volcano that displays its might with constant small outbursts, but there is always the chance that a major geological event could happen with any volcano, so we reserve the right to cancel this tour at the last minute or to halt the climb at any time for safety reasons. Wear sturdy shoes for hiking/climbing; bring insect repellent, sunscreen and sunglasses.

Baul & Democracia

Approximate Duration: 3 ½ hours

Level 1, Weight Requirements

Your excursion will take you through Escuintla towards the towns of La Democracia and Baul. La Democracia has a unique collection of monumental stone heads known as the 'fat gods'. The heads show strong Olmec influence and most were gathered from the nearby site of Monte Alto, considered one of the oldest settlements on the American continent. The sites are small but provide a glimpse of the Mayan history and the relationship between other civilizations, such as the Olmec from what is now Mexico. It is known for a fact now that the Olmecs did in fact inhabit the south coast of Guatemala. Their great influence on the Mayan civilization is visible in La Democracia, Baul and also on Takalik Abaj to the west of the first two sites. Then you'll visit the nearby Maya Museum of Las Ilusiones where several artifacts found in the area are kept. Here you'll enjoy a refreshing drink before returning to your ship.

Note: Participants must weigh no more than 250 lbs. Guests in wheelchairs must be able to leave the wheelchair upon boarding the bus. Wear comfortable shoes and bring sunscreen, insect repellent and sunglasses.

Safari Drive-Through

relevant information about the excursion. Once at the plantation, you'll have a short, 20-minute walking tour through the coffee fields and processing plant where the trail is flat, but unpaved. Then you'll watch an informative video about processing coffee, and enjoy a cup of fine Guatemalan brew before returning to your ship.

Note: participants must weigh no more than 250 lbs. Guests in wheelchairs must be able to leave the wheelchair upon boarding the bus. Wear comfortable shoes and bring a hat, sunglasses, sunscreen and cash for handicraft shopping.

Deep Sea Fishing – VIP

Approximate Duration: 6 ½ hours

Level 2, Meal, Age & Weight Requirements

The waters of Guatemala offer great opportunities to fish for dorado, marlin and sailfish. If you like deep sea fishing, you'll love Guatemala for its quantity of fish and ease of access to the Pacific. The Pacific coast of Guatemala is ranked as a top-ten spot for marlin sports fishing worldwide. Catch and release applies to all protected species during the tour.

You'll be required to sign a waiver release form in order to participate. Some light current might be present. Participants should be able to get in and out of the boat by ladder. The tour ends with a shopping stop at Plaza del Navegante, alongside the ocean.

Operated by a local environmentalist, the center works to improve the chances of survival for the endangered species of Golfina sea turtles. Learn how the program works



and see the baby turtles in various stages of development, from their eggs to the holding tanks where the hatchlings are ready to return to the sea. Walk down to the shoreline where the turtles will be named before they are released into the wild. The number of turtles that are ready for release may not always match the number of participants. A short shopping stop will be made on the way back to your ship.

Note: Bug repellent is recommended. Wear comfortable shoes.

Approximate Duration: 5 hours

Level 2, Meal, Age Requirements

Enjoy a five-hour fishing excursion to the richest game fishing grounds know to anglers. As the boat heads out to the fishing area, the poles will be set with lures by the mate to minimize the possibility of the lines becoming tangled. The type of fishing is trolling. Boats do not troll with live bait, as it is good for perhaps fifteen minutes maximum. This means the boat will be in the open ocean and four lines with lures will be utilized in pole holders



and outriggers. All of the hooked fish will be rotated between the participants on the boat. When a fish is spotted, the mate will reel in the four lines and then set a line with the live bait. If a fish takes the bait, the mate will 'set the hook' and give the pole to the first person in the fighting chair. When the first person has landed the fish (or if the fish got away), the next person will have the next hooked fish and so on. When everyone has had a turn in the chair the rotation will start over.

Note: Participants must be at least 8 years of age. Stops will be made along the way to learn about the desert flora and fauna and at a lookout point over the Pacific Ocean. Don't forget your camera as the sights on this tour are one of a kind. Upon arrival at the ranch, you'll receive a brief orientation on the



proper operating techniques of the ATV before you hop on and follow your guide for a glimpse into Baja's rugged terrain. Your off-road vehicle will take you effortlessly over hilltops and through river washes. This air-conditioned vessel is built according to U.S. Coast Guard's requirements and regulations to ensure passenger safety, comfort and security. Totally surrounded by glass paneled windows, each seat has a fabulous view and comes equipped with a fish identification card to help you identify all the unknown creatures awaiting you. Your guide will provide you an educational as well as



entertaining trip into a world normally seen through the eyes of fish. The vessel never leaves the surface as you motor along sitting safe and sound eight feet below. Just on the other side of your glass window you'll come face to face with the underwater creatures around Pelican Rock – the #1 dive spot in Cabo. Your turnaround point is Land's End, the last tip of rock, the last bit of land in Baja California. This is where the waters of the Sea of Cortez meet those of the Pacific Ocean. Go up to the surface for great photos of the arch and the sea lion colony. The sub will take you back to the pier with your memories and camera filled with the underwater wonders of Cabo!

Once on board you'll be greeted by your friendly crew who will take you out in search of the big game billfish in the area. On board you'll be provided a delicious boxed lunch and an unlimited supply of beer, soft drinks and water. Your boat comes complete with live bait, fishing licenses and all fishing equipment and tackle.

Note: Billfishing is very different from other types of fishing. The crew will rig four fishing lines with two set on outriggers and two directly from the fishing poles. These lines will trail lures. When a billfish is spotted, lines will be reeled in and live bait substituted for the lures. Boats do not troll with live bait, as live bait is good for perhaps 15 minutes only. Unless you instruct the crew otherwise, they will pick up the pole when there is a strike, hook the fish and hand you the pole. You'll fight the fish from the fishing chair. When the fish is brought alongside, the crew will gaff the fish. The catch and release of all billfish is mandatory. It is customary to tip the crew 15-20% depending on the service rendered.
